Commerce Initiates Antidumping (AD) and Countervailing Duty (CVD) Investigations on Lightweight Thermal Paper from the People's Republic of China (AD/CVD), Germany (AD) and Korea (AD)

- On October 30, the Department of Commerce announced its decisions to initiate antidumping and countervailing duty investigations on imports of lightweight thermal paper (LWTP) from the People's Republic of China (China), as well as antidumping investigations on imports of LWTP from Germany and Korea.
- The petitioner for these investigations is Appleton Papers, Inc. (WI).
- The merchandise covered by these investigations is a paper coated with chemicals that will react to form images when exposed to heat. LWTP is typically, but not exclusively, used for point-of-sale applications, such as printing receipts and coupons.
- LWTP is currently classifiable under the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS) subheadings 4811.90.8040 and 4811.90.9090. These HTSUS item numbers are basket categories, covering not only LWTP, but also other types of thermal paper and non-thermal paper. While HTSUS subheadings are provided for convenience and customs purposes, Commerce's written description of the scope of these investigations is dispositive.
- In 2006, imports of LWTP from China were valued at an estimated \$54.52 million; imports from Germany were valued at an estimated \$134.35 million; and imports from Korea were valued at an estimated \$3.22 million.

NEXT STEPS

- The U.S. International Trade Commission (ITC) is scheduled to make its preliminary injury determinations on or about November 23.
- If the ITC determines that there is a reasonable indication that imports are materially injuring, or threatening material injury to, the domestic industry, the investigations will continue, and Commerce will be scheduled to make its preliminary CVD determination in January 2008 and its preliminary AD determinations in March 2008.
