Executive summary

Much for the quarter was spent in start up activities for the new contract and completing activities for an extension to the old contract.

Personnel were our first task. Becky Hebert resigned her position effective May 26, 2006. The position was advertised on several listservs and at the Medical Library Association Placement Service in Phoenix. Recruitment efforts continued through June and telephone interviews were completed in July. In-person interviews will be held in August. Regina Johnson joined the staff as Program Management Specialist on June 5, 2006. She will be responsible for financial management of the contract and support to the executive director and coordinators. Colette Becker was out on extended sick leave from the end of May through the end of the quarter. She worked part-time from home during this time. She is expected back next quarter.

Recruitment began for a task force on disaster planning. We spent the summer recruiting the 12 members with the assistance of each state's health sciences library associations. By the end of the quarter we had over half of the members appointed. The task force will meet virtually starting in the fall. Beth Wescott will facilitate this endeavor.

Our funding opportunities for year 01 were announced in June. Promotional messages were sent to regional and state listservs. See <http://nlnm.gov/sea/funding/index.html> for more information on the ten awards and subcontract opportunities. We may have to close our exhibit awards next quarter. We have already exceeded our budgeted amount.

Resource Library agreements were sent in June to 30 libraries, the University of Maryland Health Sciences and Human Services Library will serve as the Regional Medical Library and the 31st resource library. At the end of the quarter, all but four agreements had been returned. Follow-up in August is planned.

We provided logistical support to NLM for *the Good Medicine: Native American Ways of Well-being and Health* consultation at the National Museum of the American Indian, Washington, DC June 22-23, 2006. Janice Kelly, Regina Johnson and Stephanie Dennis attended the consultation along with NLM staff and invited guests. It was decided to use unexpended funds for the second meeting to be held in New Mexico in December. Paperwork to transfer those funds is underway.

We are continuing to use the web to promote and deliver our services. Sheila continues to develop the online course, *¿No Comprendo?: Spanish Health Resources for the English Speaking Librarian* as part of her agreement with the MLA CE Institute on Developing Online Instruction. The course will be announced at the end of September 2006. Toni continues to develop and hold quarterly web conferences with hospital librarians in the region. The next scheduled event is a discussion with Susan Barnes about evaluation on August 31, 2006. Colette completed the redesign of the new website in June and continues to modify the navigation to ensure user satisfaction.
