Executive summary

Amanda Bayer (Meloy) accepted the position as Community Outreach Coordinator. Mandy will join the staff on July 9, 2007. Recently, Mandy was the outreach librarian with the Foothills Area Health Education Center, Gainesville, GA.

Beth continued on intermittent Family and Medical Leave during the quarter. She returned to full time employment on April 20, 2007.

We introduced a new service on February 28, 2007. Terri Ottosen, consumer health coordinator, was available via Instant Messenger for the new chat service, SeaCHat. Terri will schedule at least one day each month to chat with Network members. She welcomes chats at anytime she is in the office and available.

On February 1-2, 2007 Janice attended the National Emergency Preparedness Collaboration meeting, Los Angeles, CA. Following this meeting, on February 28, 2007, the Region 2 Disaster Planning Task Force met in Ocean Springs, MS. The agenda for the meeting included a review of regional and national activities by Janice Kelly, reports on the assessment of disaster plans and activities in each state, a roll out scenario by Dan Wilson, a brief review of "Changes to Gulf Coast Libraries since August 29, 2005" by Elizabeth Doolittle of the University of Southern Mississippi and a tour of the Gulf Coast area including several libraries damaged by Katrina. A tornado destroyed Sumter Regional Hospital, Americus, GA on March 1, 2007. Through the GalN network, we have been receiving regular updates from their librarian, Network member Claudia LeSueur. At this time the hospital and Claudia are still assessing their needs. We recommended to Claudia that she consider applying for an express award to assist in recovery.

The first meeting of the RAC Oversight committee was held in Baltimore on Monday, April 9, 2007. The agenda included a discussion of program committee activities, disaster planning and future plans. Advocacy activities this quarter included site visits and webconferences. SE/A staff members visited several Network member libraries in Georgia, Florida, Mississippi, and Virginia. Webconferences targeting Network members and hospital librarians included magnet status, DOCLINE reports, and LinkOut.

The year 02 budget was approved with a 3% cut from year 01 funding. In response we have been providing more distance learning opportunities such as the webconferences mentioned above.

On February 12, Beth was notified by the Medical Library Association that she won the 2007 MLA President's Award for sustained work in health information literacy. She will receive her award at the MLA meeting in Philadelphia in May.

Western Maryland AHEC - West Virginia Information Outreach II

February – April 2007. During this quarter, project activities centered on developing and planning a training session for the West Virginia Library Association's Spring Fling, which took place April 12-13 in Flatwoods, WV. The session was an overwhelming success, with standing room only for many attendees, and culminated in an invitation for the trainer to present at the group's 2008 Annual Conference.

University of Maryland, Baltimore – Health Information Outreach to Underserved Populations in Baltimore, MD

January – April, 2007 Major accomplishments included training the SWCOS trainers, setting up a wiki for the project, creating or locating training materials and getting the materials onto the Maryland Health →Go Local site. Also, they began working with community organizations March 12, 2007 and trained a total of 77 individuals through April 30, 2007.

Baptist Hospital - Health Touch: Information at Your Fingertips

February - April, 2007. Project is postponed due to PI's family leave. Extension will be requested upon return. Progress letter received. New due dates for reports sent to subcontractor.

University of Virginia - Evidence-based Public Health Informatics Training for Public Health Practitioners in Central and Southwestern Virginia

February – April 2007 – During this quarter, the principle investigators recruited 36 public health professionals from the Alleghany & New River health districts to participate in the informatics training sessions. They held multiple meetings via telephone with Jonathan Eldredge, the principal investigator of the original study. They updated the training manual and set dates for the training.

Anson Community Hospital - Linking Community Care and Health Education January – April 2007 - There was a lot of activity for this project. They conducted a major marketing campaign by telephoning, visiting, and writing churches in the community. They publicized the project with an article in the local newspaper. They investigated high speed Internet access and conducted weekly site visits and training sessions at local churches.
