

Robert F. Miller

On October 12, 1987, Officer Robert F. Miller was one of four staff (including one Lieutenant and two other officers) escorting an inmate to the Geisinger Medical Center for treatment of what was later determined to be self-inflicted wounds. As they were leaving the hospital with inmate lasiello in restraints and in a wheelchair, two associates of the inmate – Harold S. Robbins and Markus Safko – opened fire on the officers in an attempt to free inmate lasiello.

Armed with a .44 caliber pistol, Harold Robbins fired and struck Officer Miller in the pulmonary artery. In all, Robbins and Safko fired nine shots. Officer Miller was hit five times by the gunfire, which resulted in his death. A second officer and inmate lasiello were also shot, suffering less serious wounds.

One officer gave chase on foot at the hospital as lasiello and his accomplices fled in a stolen car. The Lieutenant and another officer chased them for 11 miles, finally capturing the escapee and his accomplices a short time later.

Along with his two accomplices (both of whom had criminal records), inmate lasiello and his wife, Nancy, were tried and convicted for their involvement in the death of Officer Miller. On April 21, 1989, inmate lasiello was convicted on 8 counts involving Conspiracy, Escape, Assault, and Murder. Inmate lasiello was sentenced to Life in prison plus 45 years. Nancy lasiello and Markus Safko both pleaded guilty, receiving 12 years and Life, respectively. Harold Robbins was found guilty of First Degree Murder and sentenced to Life imprisonment.
