REPORT ON IRAQ RECONSTRUCTION AVAILABLE AT GPO

WASHINGTON—The U.S. Government Printing Office (GPO) is offering *Hard Lessons: The Iraq Reconstruction Experience*, which was designed and printed by GPO employees. This publication, researched and written by the Special Inspector General for Iraq Reconstruction (SIGIR), chronicles the history of the Iraq reconstruction program from prewar planning in mid-2002 through 2008. SIGIR reviewed thousands of documents and interviewed hundreds of military members, government officials, and civilian contractors for this report, whose text is supported by about 100 pages of footnotes. The report provides thirteen lessons applicable to contingency relief and reconstruction operations, which should shape further reform of the U.S. approach to such contingencies.
