Controller of Her Majesty's Stationery Office (HMSO),
Queen's Printer of Acts of Parliament and Government
Printer for Northern Ireland. Prior to joining the Cabinet
Office in 1997, Tullo practiced law at the Bar in London
and had a successful career in law and professional
publishing. She is responsible for providing strong,
coherent leadership in information management and
policy both across government and in the wider public
sector. Tullo is a visiting professor in Information
Science at City University, London and an executive
committee member of the International Government
Printing and Publishing Association.
