Ronald A. Rosenfeld Chairman, Federal Housing Finance Board

President Bush named Ronald A. Rosenfeld to the Board and designated him Chairman on December 14, 2004. He was unanimously confirmed by the US Senate to serve a term which will expire in 2009.

From July 2001 to December 2004, Rosenfeld served as President of Ginnie Mae, the Government National Mortgage Association, a whollyowned government corporation established within the Department of Housing and Urban Development to promote nationwide access to mortgage credit.

Rosenfeld previously held the office of Secretary of Commerce in the state of Oklahoma, serving under Governor Frank Keating from 1995-98.

Rosenfeld also served in two agencies under President George H.W.

Bush. From 1992-93, he was Deputy Assistant Secretary for Corporate Finance at the Department of the Treasury. From 1989-91, he held three posts at HUD – General Deputy Assistant Secretary for Housing-Federal Housing Commissioner, Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary for Multi-Family Housing and Deputy Assistant Secretary for Single-Family Housing.

Between 1964 and 1989, Rosenfeld worked in the private sector. He was involved in the development of single family homes, apartments and condominiums as well as shopping centers. In addition his career included investment banking most notably as Executive Vice President of Prescott, Ball and Turben, Inc. a Cleveland based subsidiary of Kemper Financial Corporation.

He is a graduate of the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania and Harvard Law School. He currently serves as a member of the Smithsonian Institution National Board and as a member of the Smithsonian National Zoological Advisory Board. He is married and has three children and four grandchildren.
