SUBJECT: Improving Agency Performance Using Information and Information  
Technology: Enterprise Architecture Assessment Framework

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) is releasing the updated version of the Enterprise Architecture (EA) Assessment Framework (EAAF), "Improving Agency Performance Using Information and Information Technology". Agencies should use this document to finalize their enterprise architecture plans for FY09.

This update includes the results of extensive feedback received from agencies in September. In particular, the EA reporting and assessment cycle has been modified to further tighten alignment of EA with agency strategic planning and mission performance improvement, capital planning and investment control (CPIC), and results reporting:

- Quarterly milestone reporting – Starting in February 2009, agencies will submit a completed reporting template for each agency-defined segment.
- Annual status assessment – Starting in the FY 09 cycle, OMB will assess Completion in the 3<sup>rd</sup> fiscal quarter; assess Use in the 4<sup>th</sup> fiscal quarter, and assess Results in the 1<sup>st</sup> fiscal quarter.

Additional changes are described in the EAAF. OMB will continue to provide feedback with each submission and assessment, and will increase our emphasis on identifying and communicating opportunities for agencies to collaborate on developing and reusing core mission (i.e., Federal Health Information Sharing), business service (i.e., Financial Management, IT Infrastructure), or enterprise service (i.e., Identity Management) segment architectures.

OMB anticipates final release of the EAAF, EA Segment Report Template, the Federal Segment Architecture Methodology (FSAM) and the Federal Transition Framework (FTF) soon. We anticipate any changes to the EAAF to be non-material changes made to support final synchronization of the various documents and the EA Segment Report Template.
