A new Energy Frontier Research Center for the study of Fluid Interface Reactions, Structure and Transport (FIRST) at Oak Ridge National Laboratory is seeking a post-doctoral associate to work on a research project in the area of synthesis and characterization of functional porous materials with controlled morphologies through various synthesis techniques. Surface functionalization techniques via inorganic or organic synthesis methodologies will be extensively used to tune interfacial properties of carbon materials. Chemical Sciences Division at Oak Ridge National Laboratory is equipped with a wide range of specialized tools for synthesis and characterization of novel functional materials and assemblies.

Qualifications:

We are seeking candidates with experience in inorganic synthesis and characterization of functional nanomaterials. This position requires a Ph.D. in Chemistry or related field. Excellent oral and written communication skills are required, and presentations and publication of scientific results in peer-reviewed journals are expected. The candidate must have the ability to work in a team and interact effectively with a broad range of colleagues. Demonstrated ability to communicate in English to an international scientific audience is essential.

Applicants cannot have received the most recent degree more than five years prior to the date of application and must complete all degree requirements before starting their appointment.
