The External Dosimetry Program of the Nuclear Radiological Protection Division is looking for a Postmaster's or Postdoctoral staff member to conduct applied technical studies in personnel dosimetry. Duties will include - performing field measurements using various health physics instruments and personnel dosimeters, using themoluminescent (TLD) dosimeter readers to read dosimeters, and developing and using computational programs and techniques to analyze results.

The selected candidate may be involved in:

- Characterization of neutron radiation fields using neutron dose measuring instruments and personnel dosimeters.
- Setting up a new TLD-based extremity dosimetry system and preparing it for accreditation through the Department of Energy Laboratory Accreditation Program (DOELAP).
- Preparing specifications for and performing verification and validation of the personnel dosimetry database and applications.

Qualifications:

The position requires a Master's or Ph.D. degree in Health Physics or Nuclear Engineering with background in the use of health physics field instruments and computer applications. Research or work experience in personnel dosimetry and proficiency in multi-sphere measurements or the MCNP code is highly desirable.

Applicants cannot have received the most recent degree more than five years prior to the date of application and must complete all degree requirements before starting their appointment.
