


The original courthouse in St. Louis was a brick Federal-style building constructed in 1828. Within ten years the city's population increased threefold as a result of the flourishing fur trade, and a new courthouse was designed with four wings and a dome in the center of its axis. Originally incorporated into the new building as the east wing, the 1828 courthouse was torn down in 1851. The Old St. Louis Courthouse took on its present form in 1862 when the smaller wooden dome was replaced by the current wrought and cast-iron dome. The dome interior displays four murals depicting significant events in St. Louis history including Hernando de Soto discovering the Mississippi River.

The courthouse is perhaps best known as the location of the first two trials of the pivotal Dred Scott case. Dred Scott was born in Virginia around 1799 to parents who were enslaved. Scott's owners moved to St. Louis in 1830 and soon sold him due to financial troubles. A military surgeon purchased Scott and took him to posts in the Illinois and Wisconsin Territory where slavery was prohibited by the Missouri Compromise of 1820. The surgeon returned to St. Louis in 1842 with Scott who by then was married. On April 6, 1846, Dred Scott and his wife Harriet filed suit for their freedom. The case came to trial in 1847 in the first floor west wing courtroom and while they lost due to hearsay evidence, the Scotts were granted a second trial in the same courtroom in 1850. At the new trial a jury awarded Dred Scott and his family their freedom. However, after a series of appeals, the case was heard by the Supreme Court where in a majority opinion it was determined that Dred Scott was not a citizen of the United States and therefore had no right to bring suit in the federal courts. In addition, the opinion stated that Scott despite living in "free" territory for a number of years had never been free as slaves were personal property. The conclusion was that the Missouri Compromise of 1820 was unconstitutional and the federal government had no right to prohibit slavery in the new territories. The Dred Scott Decision helped move the country to the brink of civil war.

The Old St. Louis Courthouse was also the site where Virginia Minor's case for a woman's right to vote came to trial in the 1870s. The founder of Missouri's women's suffrage movement, Mrs. Minor attempted to register to vote and was denied because she was female. Her husband sued on her behalf. While the case was lost, it brought the suffrage movement to the forefront when in an appeal to the Supreme Court in 1874 the lower court's ruling that suffrage applied to Missouri's male citizens only was upheld.

The building continued to serve as the St. Louis City Courthouse until 1930. It was transferred to the federal government in 1940 and has been operated by the National Park Service as a museum since 1943.

Friends and colleagues:

Welcome to the tenth annual Directory of National Park Service Historians. As you might know, 2005 marks the 70th anniversary of the Historic Sites Act which was enacted on August 21, 1935. The Act declared it "a national policy to preserve for the public use historic sites, buildings and objects of national significance for the inspiration and benefit of the people of the United States." The first application of the act came in December of 1935 when President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed an Executive Order allocating funds to the Secretary of the Interior for the acquisition and development of the Jefferson National Expansion Memorial, in St. Louis, Missouri. The Old St. Louis Courthouse, the landmark featured in this edition of the directory, was one of eight sites named in the order. The federal government took over management of the courthouse in 1940 and the National Park Service opened it as a museum in 1943. Information on the significance of the Old St. Louis Courthouse can be found on the directory's inside cover.

Nearly 300 historians representing the Service's 387 parks, Washington headquarters, regional offices, and program centers are listed in this directory. Although most of these historians focus on the history presented to the public in the national park system, many work with the National Register of Historic Places, the National Historic Landmarks Survey, the Historic American Buildings Survey, the Historic American Engineering Record, and other NPS programs extending beyond the parks. You will find indexes to historians by park or office, by subject specialty and by state on pages 61, 65 and 69 respectively.

Past editions of this directory have proved valuable references for those involved with history and cultural resource management both in and outside the NPS. I hope and expect that the present edition will continue to strengthen the connections among NPS historians and between them and others interested in our work.

This directory is intended to list all National Park Service historians in the following categories:

- NPS employees officially classified as historians by inclusion in the GS-170 series.
- Persons not in the GS-170 series who (1) have either a graduate degree in history or a bachelor's degree in history with a record of graduate - level scholarship in publications or other media, and (2) are engaged primarily in historical research, historical interpretation, or cultural resource management.
- Employees with a PhD in history whose positions are not primarily history - related but who maintain currency in the profession and wish to be included.

The directory includes the following information on each person listed:

- Name (last, first, middle initial)
- Highest academic degree, granting school, year granted
- Up to three areas of professional specialty (e.g., U.S. military, African American, CRM)
- Position title, park or office, mailing address, telephone number, fax number, e-mail address (as available)

Historians who are not NPS employees but who work in NPS offices and report to NPS managers under long - term contracts or cooperative agreements with other organizations are indicated by an asterisk (*).

Historians not in the GS-170 series and not possessing a graduate degree must submit evidence of graduate-level scholarship in publications or other media to be listed.
