## **Olympics Facilities Projects**

## Vancouver

Olympic Village – US\$ 73 million worth of Accommodations and facilities will be built for 2100 athletes and officials, with 56,700 sq. meters of housing and 3,300 sq. meters of commercial space.

Indoor Speed Skating Oval – a US\$ 49 million long track speed skating oval will be built at Simon Fraser University.

Winter Sports Center – a US\$ 30 million dollar Sports Center will be built on the University of British Columbia campus.

Emergency Services Communication Center - US\$ 30 million will be invested in a state-of-the-art facility for coordinating communications and emergency services during the 2010 Olympics.

Hillcrest Park Stadium – a US\$ 20 million community center will be built, with 10-12 sheets of ice and seating capacity for 6,000 spectators.

Hastings Park - US\$ 17 million will be spent on renovations of the Pacific Coliseum for figure skating and short track speed skating.

Cypress Mountain modifications - US\$ 8 million for run modifications and spectator facilities for free style skiing and snowboarding, plus additional snowmaking equipment.

General Motors Place - US\$ 4 million for renovation and enlargement of ice surfaces for Olympic competition.

B.C. Place - US\$ 2 million for renovation and facilities to accommodate the opening, closing and medal ceremonies.

Vancouver Arena - US\$ 2 million for renovations for ice hockey training.

## Whistler

Olympic Village - US\$ 70 million to provide accommodations and facilities for 2,000 athletes and officials, with 37,880 sq. meters of housing and 2,800 sq. meters of commercial space.

Nordic Center – US\$ 73 million to develop 50 km. of new trails and facilities for biathlon, cross country, Nordic combined, ski jumps (197 ft. & 296 ft.) and paralympic Nordic events.

Sliding Center - US\$ 39 million for new bobsled, skeleton at luge tracks.

Creekside Resort - US\$ 12 million for run modifications and spectator facilities for alpine downhill, super G, and combined downhill and paralympic alpine events.

Blackcomb Resort - US\$ 5 million to modify runs and build spectator facilities for alpine giant slalom and slalom events.

Entertainment Center – construction of a US\$ 3 million multi-purpose facility, including a hockey rink, to host the paralympic sledge hockey events.
