




What is an Estuary?

- •Where land, rivers, the ocean and the atmosphere intersect
- Brackish water
- •80% 95% of commercial seafood species spend some part of its life cycle here
- •There are 2 million acres of estuaries in North Carolina

Salt Marsh

- •Salt Marsh Cordgrass (Spartina alterniflora)
- •Is the basis for the estuarine food web




Mud Flat

- •Changes with the tides
- Great habitat for snails and worms
- •Can be really salty from the evaporating salt water



Maritime Forest

- •Unique natural areas that have a variety of different trees:
 - Live Oak
 - Loblolly Pine
 - •Southern and Red Cedars
- •Rapidly disappearing due to coastal development



What areas are protected within the North Carolina National Estuarine Research Reserve?








Emily and Richardson Preyer Buckridge 26,000 acres Tyrrell County










Buxton Woods 970 acres Dare County













Permuda Island 50 acres Onslow County




Bald Head Woods 174 acres Brunswick County
