# Grand Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve: A Living Laboratory








### What is an Estuary?

An estuary is a partially enclosed body of water where saltwater from the sea mixes with freshwater from rivers, streams and creeks. These areas of transition between the land and the sea are tidally driven, like the sea, but sheltered from the full force of ocean wind and waves, more like a river.



occur where Rivers (Bayous) meet the Sea...


## Where Saltwater mixes with Freshwater to form Brackish water

## Estuaries are among the most biologically productive ecosystems on the planet!

More than two thirds of the fish and shellfish we eat spend some part of their lives in estuaries.



### What is a National Estuarine Research Reserve (NERR)?



The NERRS is a network of protected areas established to improve the health of the nations estuaries and coastal habitats by developing and providing information that promotes informed resource management

#### Protect Representative Estuaries

- 25 NERRS include over one million acres of the nation's most productive coastal waters and lands
- Research and lessons learned at NERR sites are relative to coastal decision-makers which will in turn serve to assist protection of other estuaries



#### Over one million acres of estuarine habitat are protected by the NERRS





By 2005 we envision educators transferring Ispindoet information and research data to coastal decisionmakers so they can use it to make wellinformed choices




#### Vision of Success


