## Coast Guard gets new escort for nuke subs

**KINGS BAY, GA**. - The Coast Guard cutter Sea Dog (WPB 87373) is scheduled to arrive at Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay Monday at approximately 4:00 p.m. Sea Dog is an 87-foot coastal patrol boat commanded by Chief Warrant Officer Tyrome Tillett, and it has an assigned crew of 10 Coast Guard personnel. Sea Dog is the 73rd Marine Protector Class patrol boat constructed by Bollinger Shipyards of Lockport, La. Among many upgrades and uses of advance technology are integrated bridge systems and a stern launched small boat.

Sea Dog will be joining the cutter Sea Dragon, which was formally commissioned in January 2008. Both Coast Guard cutters are assigned to Coast Guard Maritime Force Protection Unit Kings Bay, which provides dedicated security to the Navy's submarine fleet as they transit in and out of Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay.

Sea Dog will be formally commissioned during a ceremony scheduled for July 2 at Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay. Rear Adm. Steve Branham, Commander, Seventh Coast Guard District, will preside over the time-honored naval tradition, which marks the formal establishment of the new cutter. U.S. Sen. Saxby Chambliss is scheduled to attend the commissioning along with his wife, Julianne. Mrs. Chambliss is the ship's sponsor and will also speak during the ceremony.

#### CO's Corner -

Hello from Topeka, Kansas where the heat of summer is already here. Since the last issue, we met with the Coast Guard Retired Council in Washington DC, to hear their concerns on behalf of PPC Topeka Retired and Annuitant customers. They brought up the following three issues: 1. They would like to see self service computer options for our retired annuitant customers. 2. They would like to make sure reserves between Ret 2 and Ret 1 status remain in touch with updated addresses and e-mail information on file. 3. They would like to go to electronic distribution of "The Retired Newsletter" eventually for those that prefer that option.

Here is our feedback on these issues: 1. We want to provide self service options for Retired and Annuitant customers, but CG policy currently prohibits sending passwords to home computers not on the .mil network, effectively precluding this service at this time. We will continue to advocate for self service and work to resolve the information security concerns with headquarters. 2. We welcome updated information at any time through our Customer Call Center for those between Ret 2 and Ret 1 status. When a member is six months away from Ret 1 status we send information to their address on file so they can be ready to request and receive their benefits when they turn sixty. Once a member attains Ret 1 status they work directly with the Retiree & Annuitant Services (RAS) Branch. 3. We will move to electronic and e-mail options where possible, but will provide an option for those that prefer to continue to receive a hard copy of the newsletter. It is very important that all our customers keep their contact information updated with us. We welcome your input on these issues.

As reported last issue, our Concurrent Retirement and Disability Payments (CRDP) record review has been completed. We are still responding to valid inquiries on this and also seeing some negative blog comments from a vocal minority of customers. Please let me remind everyone in this category that the Veteran's Administration (VA) is still dealing with challenges in this area. As reported, we provided all data to the VA computer data center. When you call the VA central customer service number or the regional office, they may tell you they haven't gotten info from the Coast Guard. This is most likely due to the VA not disseminating the data within their system to one of their 50 regional service centers. CG veterans on their "Benefits Data Network" (BDN) system have probably already been paid. Unfortunately, payments for veterans on their "VetsNet" system (majority of CG vets) may take longer as the VA is manually processing those payments.

I was very gratified to get the following survey comment from a retired Coastie just yesterday: "I have to assist DOD retirees on many occasions with unraveling problems with DFAS and I am so happy that my retired pay, CRDP, etc. is kept in the CG family." He felt strongly enough that he called me personally to recognize PPC service. We want all of our customers to feel that same way!

### Nearly six months after startup, the new TRDP contract is in full swing

On April 1, 2009, the TRICARE Retiree Dental Program (TRDP) will celebrate its sixth month of operations under a new contract. Delta Dental of California began the new five-year term as administrator of the TRDP on October 1, 2008; they have administered the program since it began in 1998, and in the fall of 2007, the Department of Defense awarded Delta Dental the contract to continue to administer the TRDP through September 2013.

The TRDP, authorized by Congress as part of the National Defense Authorization Act for fiscal year 1997, offers affordable dental benefits as a voluntary option to the nation's five million-plus Uniformed Services retirees and their eligible family members. With a current enrollment of over 1.1 million covered lives, the TRDP is the nation's largest voluntary, all-enrollee-paid dental program.

With the new contract that began October 1, the Enhanced TRDP featured some additions to an already comprehensive scope of benefits, such as coverage of dental implant services at 50 percent of allowable charges, an increase in the orthodontic lifetime maximum from \$1,200 to \$1,500, and 80 percent coverage for posterior composite fillings. Also starting October 1, TRDP benefits under the new Enhanced-Overseas Program were made available to retirees and their eligible family members who reside overseas. Until then, enrollees had to return to the Enhanced TRDP service area to receive dental care. Additionally, Enhanced Program enrollees who live within the service area are now covered for emergency treatment when they are traveling outside the service area.

The TRDP is a national, combined fee-for-service/preferred provider program that offers enrollees access to any licensed dentist in all 50 states as well as the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands and Canada. While enrollees may seek care from any licensed dentist in this service area, optimal benefits will be available to those enrolled retirees and their family members who choose a participating network dentist.

After a mandatory 12-month enrollment obligation is satisfied, enrollees can remain in the program on a month-to-month basis. The Basic Program remains closed to new enrollees but continues with no change in benefits for those already enrolled and who wish to remain enrolled. The TRDP carries a \$50-per-person-per-year deductible with a family cap of \$150 and an annual maximum of \$1,200 per person (\$1,000 for Basic Program enrollees) against which preventive and diagnostic services are not counted. Coverage for these services as well as for basic restorative services, periodontic service, endodontic services, oral surgery and dental emergencies is available immediately upon the effective date of coverage. Crowns, bridges, full and partial dentures, many implant services and orthodontics will be available after only 12 months of continuous enrollment, payable at 50 percent.

## President Obama's 2010 Spending Plan Initiates Transformation for VA Services

#### Record Budget Enhances VA's Ability to Become a 21<sup>st</sup> Century Organization

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Today, the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) announced President Obama's 2010 budget for VA. The budget emphasizes a Veteran-centric commitment to expanded services with a 15.5 percent increase over 2009, the largest percentage increase for VA requested by a president in more than 30 years.

"Our 2010 budget represents the President's vision for how VA will transform into a 21<sup>st</sup> Century organization that is Veteran-centric, results-driven, and forward-looking," Secretary of Veterans Affairs Eric K. Shinseki said. "This transformation is demanded by new times, new technologies, new demographic realities, and new commitments to today's Veterans. It requires a comprehensive review of the fundamentals in every line of operation the Department performs. We must be sure that valuable taxpayer dollars are invested in programs that work for our Veterans."

The centerpiece of the \$112.8 billion VA budget proposal is a dramatic increase in Veteran health care funding, with an 11 percent increase over the current year's funding (excluding one-time Recovery Act funds).

"Organizational transformation requires changes in culture, systems, and training, "Deputy Secretary of Veterans Affairs W. Scott Gould said. "This will require resources, but it will also demand commitment and teamwork. The entire Department is dedicated to serving the needs of Veterans, and every VA employee has a stake in transformation to meet those needs."

That transformation is already underway. For instance, the enhanced use of automated tools, coupled with more efficient processes, recent staffing increases, and improved training is expected to reduce the compensation and pension claims processing time to 150 days in 2010, or 16 percent faster compared to 2008, while reducing the pending inventory and improving accuracy. VA anticipates an 8 percent increase in education claims in 2010 compared to this year due largely to the improved education benefits of the Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Act. Nonetheless, VA's goal is to complete all education claims without any increase in average processing days. "We are making the smart choices today to improve the services that our Veterans receive tomorrow," Secretary Shinseki said.

VA's budget request contains four major categories of activities. These activities include: creating a reliable management infrastructure, delivering ongoing services, making progress on Departmental priorities, and instituting new initiatives critical to meeting the needs of Veterans now and in the future.

Nearly two-thirds of the increase (\$9.6 billion) would go to mandatory programs (up 20 percent); the remaining third (\$5.6 billion) would be discretionary funding (up 11 percent) The total budget would be almost evenly split between mandatory funding (\$56.9 billion) and discretionary funding (\$55.9 billion).

VA's new budget request provides for an estimated 122,000 more patients to be treated over the current year. Many of these patients will have multiple visits in the course of the year. VA expects to end fiscal year 2010 with nearly 6.1 million individual patients having received care, including 419,000 Veterans of the Iraq and Afghanistan war zones who separated from service.

"VA has too often in the past been seen as difficult and bureaucratic as it relates to its charge of providing for our Nation's Veterans," Secretary Shinseki said. "Changing that perception will require a significant transformation. We will not nibble at the edges of this change. We must be bold and demand that we begin immediately showing measurable returns on investment in a responsible, accountable and transparent manner."

**STATE TAX REMINDER:** As a reminder when moving from one state to another and updating your home mailing address, don't forget to change your state tax withholdings. The retiree must request a change for state tax as an address change does not automatically change or stop the state information that the tax is being paid to.

<u>Coast Guard/NOAA Retiree Personnel Locator</u>: If you are searching for a Coast Guard/NOAA retired individual, we can help. Place your personal correspondence to that individual in a sealed envelope, making sure to include how they can get in touch with you. #### KEEPING RETIREE & ANNUITANT SERVICES INFORMED

All retirees are reminded to inform PPC (RAS) as soon as possible following changes of marital status (divorce, death, annulment, marriage, just to mention some), death of a designated SBP beneficiary, or any other changes which could impact retired pay. Additionally, when you make a change with DEERS it <u>does not</u> constitute a change to your Retired Pay account since DEERS is a totally different system from RAS.

#### VA compensation payments and federal income taxes

If you retired from the USCG or NOAA based on years of service and are later given a retroactive service connected disability rating by the VA, your retirement pay for the retroactive period is excluded from income up to the amount of VA disability benefits that you would have been entitled to receive. The form 1099R reports the entire distribution because the income, when paid, was taxable under the law.

A corrected form 1099R which could support the decrease in taxable income will not be issued by PPC. This policy is contained in the DOD Financial Management Regulations, VOL 7B and also is stated in the IRS instructions for form 1099R, which directs that the entire income distribution will be reported if a part is taxable and a part is not taxable.

Retirees who are affected by this policy should consult a tax preparer for assistance. The retiree should provide copies of the Form 1099R and the VA Award Letter to claim a refund of taxes paid on the excludable amount.

You may also claim a refund of any taxes paid on an excludable amount in previous years by filing an amended return on Form 1040X, subject to Statute of Limitations. The Coast Guard/NOAA Retirees' Newsletter

The budget supports the administration's goal to gradually expand health care eligibility to more than 500,000 new enrollees by 2013, while maintaining excellent care quality and timeliness. In 2010, the transformation of VA health care will support scheduling of 98 percent of primary care appointments within a month of the desired date.

The new budget proposal places a high priority on initiatives aimed at making servicemembers' transition to civilian life and VA benefits seamless. This includes the President's initiative for VA and the Department of Defense to collaboratively develop and implement a joint "Virtual Lifetime Electronic Record." The new system supports the administration's initiative for a uniform registration of all servicemembers with VA, will improve delivery of benefits by assuring availability of medical and administrative data useful both in future medical care as well as in the determination of serviceconnection in disability ratings.

"The Department's number one priority is providing for our Veterans," Deputy Secretary Gould said. "We have an obligation to make sure that every dollar goes to delivering timely, high-quality benefits and services to our clients—the Veterans. A strong corporate model will enable decentralized provision of services at VA by professionals in the field while providing integrated policy and coordination through a central office." The fiscal year 2010 VA budget fosters strong support for Veteran-focused information technology, providing more than \$3.3 billion to ensure reliable, accessible and secure computer systems. In addition to improvements in VA's electronic health records, this investment will support the President's goal of making claims decisions timely, fair, and consistent with the extension of a new paperless processing initiative expected to lead to an electronically based benefits system by 2012.

VA-managed national cemeteries will be preserved as shrines while maintaining the current high level of service. The National Cemetery Administration would receive \$242 million in operations and maintenance funding in the fiscal year 2010 request. The budget provides for activation of three new national cemeteries, Bakersfield National Cemetery in California, Alabama National Cemetery near Birmingham, and Washington Crossing National Cemetery in southeastern Pennsylvania. VA expects to perform 111,500 interments in 2010, a four-percent increase from the estimate for the current year.

The President's budget for construction projects and other capital programs in VA is more than \$1.9 billion. This continues work on five major medical projects already in progress, begins seven new ones, and provides resources to support the cemetery system's expansion needs, including resources for improvements at Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery in Elwood, Illinois, and Houston National Cemetery. It also contains \$600 million for minor construction projects, \$85 million in grants for construction of state extended care facilities, and \$42 million in grants for state Veterans cemeteries.

The seven new medical facility projects move VA towards new construction or renovations at VA medical facilities in Brockton, Massachusetts; Canandaigua, New York; Livermore, California; Long Beach, California; Perry Point, Maryland; San Diego, California; and St. Louis, Missouri. Capital funds also will support ongoing improvements at medical centers in Bay Pines, Florida; Denver, Colorado; Orlando, Florida; San Juan, Puerto Rico; and St. Louis, Missouri.

#### White House Gives Welcome News to NAUS: No **TRICARE Fee Increase**

Springfield, Virginia (5/6/09) - Bill Matz, President of the National Association for Uniformed Services<sup>®</sup> (NAUS), was called by White House staff assistant Matthew Flavin, and told that the President's 2010 Budget, due to be released in the next few days, will not include any TRI-CARE fee increases. The White House call was in response to NAUS' strongly worded letter hand-delivered by Matz when he met President Obama in early April. This is welcome news for military health care system beneficiaries, who have battled against Defense Department plans to increase TRICARE fees for the past three years. Until receipt of the White House call, the new Administration plans were uncertain. It was widely thought that the Pentagon would continue its attack on TRICARE fees as recommended by the Defense Department's hand-picked 2007 Task Force on the Future of Military Health Care.

Matz was told that the President used words to the effect of, We're not touching TRICARE. The President also said, "We have a sacred trust to those who wear the uniform of the United States of America. It's a commitment that begins at enlistment, and it must never end."

"This is an important budget victory and shows that President Obama is willing to listen to the concerns of our nation's uniformed servicemembers and retirees," Matz said. "Giving priority in the budget to the health care promises made to our men and women who serve, and have served, in uniform is an important recognition of our nation's commitment to those who serve and sacrifice in her defense...particularly, when we're at war."

## VA Accepting Applications for Post-9/11 GI Bill Benefits

WASHINGTON (May 1, 2009) - The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) announced today that Veterans can begin submitting applications on-line for the Post-9/11 GI Bill.

"There is no better investment than education," said Tammy Duckworth, VA's assistant secretary for public and intergovernmental affairs. "The Post-9/11 GI Bill will provide new opportunities that are essential to our Veterans, our workforce and our economy."

Veterans, service members, reservists and National Guard members with active duty since Sept. 10, 2001, may be eligible for this benefit. Veterans will remain eligible for benefits for 15 years from the date of last discharge or release from a period of active duty of at least 90 continuous days. Eligible applicants must have served for an aggregate period of at least 90 days since Sept. 10, 2001, or served at least 30 continuous days on active duty since Sept. 10, 2001, and received a discharge for disability.

Benefit payment rates range from 40 percent of the maximum benefit for an person with at least 90 days, but less than 6 months of aggregate service and up to 100 percent of the benefit for people with at least 36 months of aggregate service or 30 continuous days and a discharge due to a service connected disability. Prospective beneficiaries may apply on-line through the GI Bill Web site at <u>http://www.gibill.va.gov/</u>.

Qualified Veterans will receive a "Certification of Eligibility" as well as additional information regarding

## NOAA, National Association of Black Scuba Divers Explore Shared History

May 20, 2009

NOAA archaeologists will be in the Florida Keys this month training members of the National Association of Black Scuba Divers in underwater archaeology as part of a new education initiative to explore the maritime heritage of African-Americans and engage the community in marine resource conservation.

"By telling the many stories about African-Americans in seafaring, naval service, and the maritime trades, the project inspires a rediscovery of African-American maritime roots," said Tim Runyan, NOAA maritime heritage program manager.



Fifteen participants will be taught the science of maritime archaeology and learn basic underwater surveying, recording and mapping techniques during the May 22-24 training course. The course will include classroom and fieldwork exercises on a shipwreck in the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary, stress the importance of conservation and preservation of the nation's underwater cultural heritage.

NABS member Bill Murrain said the dive group's commitment to education and public outreach aligns perfectly with the African-American "Voyage of Discovery" education and outreach initiative coordinated by the NOAA Office of National marine Sanctuaries.

"African-Americans have made significant contributions to the country's maritime history and the archaeological training course will give NABS an opportunity to help bring this history to wider public, "Murrain said.

The training is also part of a larger NOAA effort to create a cadre of skilled volunteers who can assist with archaeological field work and historic research occurring within the National Marine Sanctuary System.

NOAA's Maritime Heritage Program and the Nautical Archaeology Society developed the training course to introduce divers to the field of maritime archaeology. Since the training program began, about 20 people have been trained as volunteer divers, seven of whom have become members of the national marine sanctuary volunteer diving program.

NOAA understands and predicts changes in the Earth's environment, from the depths of the ocean to the surface of the sun, and conserves and manages our coastal and marine resources.
