# Application for Special-Purpose Subzone with FTZ Manufacturing Authority

The format for this form is based on the Foreign-Trade Zones Board's regulations, which require a "five-exhibit" format for all applications involving new sites for FTZ activity. This form puts those requirements into a simple structure to make the subzone application process as easy as possible.

#### **OVERVIEW OF APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:**

The following types of information and documentation are needed to complete this form:

**Letter of transmittal:** A letter from the sponsoring FTZ's "grantee" organization transmitting your subzone application. The letter must be signed by an authorized officer of the grantee organization.

**Executive summary:** A brief description of the proposed subzone's sites and the proposed activity.

**Exhibit 1 (legal authority to apply):** Information that establishes that your state has a current law allowing operation of the sponsoring "grantee" foreign-trade zone organization. The grantee in question should be able to provide guidance on this issue.

**Exhibit 2 (site description):** Because a subzone will be treated, for customs purposes, as if it is outside U.S. territory, it is essential for U.S. Customs and Border Protection's oversight of the subzone that you provide descriptions of the subzone's site(s). This includes a "legal description" for each site – an official legal description for a given parcel is something that should be available from your county courthouse, recorder of deeds, or similar local administrative entity.

**Exhibit 3 (operation and financing):** Brief questions on ownership and operation at the proposed subzone's site(s).

**Exhibit 4 (economic justification):** This is the heart of the subzone manufacturing application. This form provide spaces for you to answer a series of straightforward questions about your company and its situation relative to its competitors (both domestic and foreign). In essence, simply "tell your story" here – why is subzone status important for your company's international competitiveness?

**Exhibit 5 (maps):** As with the legal descriptions in Exhibit 2, effective oversight of your subzone requires that you provide clear maps delineating the boundaries of the site(s).




