Telephone: 816-926-6454 Fax: 816-823-1805 The Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008 (the 2008 Act) initiates a program whereby payments will be made to eligible participants. The Regulations and Agreement (enclosed) set forth the terms and conditions under which the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) will make payments.

The program will pay \$.04/lb. for eligible cotton through July 31, 2012. All payments received by the Agreement Holder must be used for purposes as specified in the 2008 Act. Authorized expenditures include costs incurred for purchases of land or the acquisition, construction, installation, modernization, development, conversion, or expansion of depreciable fixed assets. Such capital expenditures must be directly attributable to the purpose of manufacturing upland cotton into eligible cotton products in the United States. Capital obligations entered into prior to June 18, 2008, will not be eligible.

Effective Date:

Agreements accepted by CCC by January 30, 2009, will be effective August 1, 2008. All Agreements received thereafter will be effective on the date of acceptance by CCC.

Agreements:

Prior to CCC entering into an agreement, a telephone interview and/or physical inspection of the facility will take place.

DUNS Number:
