## NN/LM National Emergency Preparedness Project Baseline Preparedness Assessment Middle Atlantic Region Summary Report

In April 2008, MAR conducted a baseline assessment of all Full Network Members as part of the National Emergency Preparedness Project conducted across all regions of NN/LM. The intent of the baseline project was to assess the level of emergency preparedness in each region, and to determine the training needs of network members on this topic.

The Emergency Preparedness Project Baseline Preparedness Assessment was facilitated through an online questionnaire tool using SurveyMonkey. The online questionnaire link was emailed to 380 MAR Full Network Members considered to be health science libraries. Members had access to the online questionnaire for four weeks. After the first week the questionnaire was available, the MAR staff telephoned all non-respondents to encourage completion of the questionnaire. Two hundred and seventy-six members responded to the questionnaire resulting in a 72.6% response rate.

More than half of the respondents, 69.5%, do not have emergency preparedness and response plans for their library (Table 1). Many respondents acknowledge limited staff time (57%) and limited staff knowledge about emergency planning (49%) as barriers on the library's ability to develop emergency preparedness plans (Table 3). A majority of the respondents, 84%, have not participated in training for emergency preparedness and response for libraries in the past two years (Table 4). Respondents showed a great interest in specific types of training support from NN/LM for emergency preparedness (see Table 5).
