

MILVAX Monthly on-line Vaccine Lecture Series Webcasts

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About the Webcast Series

The MILVAX Online Vaccine Series is a monthly webcast on vaccines and vaccine-related topics that provide consistent, accurate and timely education to both DoD and civilian healthcare providers. Specialists are invited each month to speak on a variety of vaccine-related topics, and attendees can participate in a live, moderated Q&A forum with the guest speaker. The MILVAX on-line Vaccine Lecture Series is part of the continued expansion of the MILVAX Immunization University (ImzU) educational outreach initiative.

In order to attend a webcast, you must register for the event through the MyImzU interface located at www.vaccines.mil/mylmzU. Once you have registered for an ImzU account, you can select an available webcast or view an archived webcast under the "Webcasts" tab. After attending the webcast you may download and print a certificate of completion.

Technology

These webcasts are broadcast using Adobe Connect and require the Flash Player 9 or above be installed on the local system.

Troubleshooting

If you have a problem viewing a webcast, there are two likely sources:

1. There is an interruption of your internet connectivity.
2. You do not have the current version of the Flash Player installed

To ensure that you are able to connect and view the webcast optimally, please observe the following requirements:

- Have a dedicated internet connection (broadband or higher connection speed is recommended)
- Have Adobe Flash Player version 9 or later browser plug-in
- Have computer speaker(s) and the volume turned up
- Optional headset can be used if you do not have speakers
