


Goods-producing industries made up 21 percent of private industry employment and accounted for 32 percent of injuries and illnesses with days away from work (DAFW) in 2006. Service-providing industries made up 79 percent of employment and accounted for 68 percent of DAFW injuries and illnesses in 2006.

The rate of DAFW injuries and illnesses in service providing industries was 115 per 10,000 full-time workers, while the DAFW rate in goods-producing industries was 167 per 10,000 full-time workers.

Floors and ground surfaces were the most common source of injuries in service-providing industries. In goods-producing industries, parts and materials were the most common source of injuries.
