## The South Atlantic region (9 States) comprised more than 18 percent of national establishments, employment, and total wages in 2007, the largest shares of any region.

The Pacific region, whose 5 states constituted nearly 19 percent of all establishments in 2007, made up less than 16 percent of all jobs, indicating this region has a smaller worker-to-establishment ratio than the rest of the Nation. The East South Central region (4 States) comprised less than 5 percent of total wages across the U.S., the smallest share of any region. The New England region (6 States) comprised less than 6 percent of employment across the Nation, the smallest share of any region in this category.
