

On The Map Version 2 Major Features

Local Employment Dynamics  All About Jobs

The planned coverage and major features in version 2 of *On The Map* include:

- As many as 44 states under the Local Employment Dynamics (LED) partnership that have passed the Experimental Production¹ stage and will be in the Regular Production² stage on or before June 1, 2007;
- Addition of 2004 data to 2002-2003 data that are available in version 1;
- Cross-state patterns for all participating states, including the retrofitting of 2002-2003 data;
- Expansion of reports to include side-by-side 3-year comparisons of 2002-2004 data; and
- Workforce Innovation in Regional Economic Development (WIRED) regions³ and Congressional Districts as additional selectable geographical layers.

TENTATIVE RELEASE SCHEDULE

Version 2.0 – March 2007 – 3 LED state partners covering Alabama, Georgia, and North Carolina.

Version 2.1 – May 2007 - 14 LED state partners covering California, Colorado, Florida, Idaho, Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, Missouri, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Texas, Virginia, and Washington.

Version 2.2 – July 2007 – 17 LED state partners covering Arkansas, Delaware, Hawaii, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Maine, Maryland, Montana, Nevada, New Jersey, New Mexico, South Carolina, Tennessee, Vermont, West Virginia, and Wisconsin.

Version 2.3 – September 2007 – as many as 10 LED state partners covering Arizona, District of Columbia, Louisiana, Michigan, Mississippi, North Dakota, Rhode Island, Utah, Wyoming, and an additional state that is in Regular Production on or before the June 1, 2007 timeline.
