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## NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS

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Following is a schedule of Commission meetings which will be conducted under provisions of the Government in the Sunshine Act. In general, the Commission expects to follow a schedule of holding closed meetings on Tuesdays, and open meetings on Thursday morning. Meetings on Wednesday, and if necessary on Thursday afternoons, will be either open or closed according to the requirements of agenda items under consideration.

Visitors are welcome at all open meetings, insofar as space is available.

Meetings will be held in the Commission Meeting Room, Room 1C30, at the Commission's headquarters building, 450 Fifth Street, NW, Washington, DC. Persons wishing to photograph or videotape Commission meetings must obtain permission in advance from the Secretary of the Commission. ### OPEN MEETING - THURSDAY, MAY 21, 1987 - 10:00 a.m.

The subject matter of the May 21 open meeting will be:

- (2) Consideration of whether to issue a release adopting a new rule and amendments to existing rules intended to simplify the filing requirements applicable to a registration statement at the time of effectiveness. New Rule 430A allows registrants, if specified conditions are satisfied, to omit information concerning the public offering price, price-related information and the underwriting syndicate from a prospectus contained in a registration statement at the time that it is declared effective. In addition, the Commission has adopted changes to provide for a shortened filing period for certain prospectuses, to eliminate unnecessary filings, and to classify prospectuses according to the nature of the information being modified or added. - (3) Consideration of whether to issue a release adopting amendments to its proxy rules and certain other rules including changes to conform further the proxy disclosure for mergers and similar transactions to that required for registration of securities in certain business combinations. 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## **CIVIL PROCEEDINGS**

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### **THE ROLFITE COMPANY ENJOINED**

The Commission announced that on May 12 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against The Rolfite Company of Miami, Florida. The Judgment restrained and enjoined Rolfite from failing to file timely and in proper form accurate and complete periodic reports and Notifications of Late Filing.

In its March 31 complaint, the Commission alleged that Rolfite, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct extending over several years, failed to file its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended December 31, 1985 and its Quarterly Reports on Form 10-Q for its fiscal quarters ended March 31, June 30, and September 30, 1986. Rolfite, consenting to the Court's Judgment, admitted that it failed to file or filed late 19 Annual and Quarterly Reports and failed to file five Notifications of Late Filing. (SEC v. The Rolfite Company, USDC DC, Civil Action No. 87-0881). (LR-11434)

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## **INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

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### **HAL ROACH STUDIOS, INC.**

An order has been issued declaring Hal Roach Studios, Inc. to be primarily engaged in a business other than that of investing, reinvesting, owning, holding or trading in securities. (Rel. IC-15730 - May 12)

### **FSA CAPITAL, INC.**

An order has been issued amending an existing order by FSA Capital, Inc. exempting it from all provisions of the Investment Company Act to permit the issuance of mortgage-backed securities having adjustable interest rates, the election of REMIC status, and the sale of residual interests. (Rel. IC-15731 - May 12)

### **CITICMO, INC.**

An order has been issued exempting CitiCMO, Inc., and certain trusts created by it, from all provisions of the Investment Company Act in connection with the issuance of mortgage-backed securities and beneficial interests in such trusts. (Rel. IC-15732 - May 12)

### **SANTA BARBARA FUNDING II, INC.**

An order has been issued on the application filed by Santa Barbara Funding II, Inc. amending an existing order (Rel. IC-15201, July 14, 1986) so that it may issue variable and floating interest rate mortgage-backed securities. (Rel. IC-15733 - May 12)

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## **HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

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### **MISSISSIPPI POWER AND LIGHT COMPANY**

A supplemental order releasing jurisdiction has been issued authorizing Mississippi Power & Light Company, subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., to waive its contractual authority to exercise an optional redemption provision contained in two outstanding series of pollution control bonds for 13 years. (Rel. 35-24388 - May 12)

### **LACLEDE ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE; RALLS COUNTY ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE**

Orders have been issued granting Laclede Electric Cooperative and Ralls County Electric Cooperative an exemption under Section 3(a)(1) from all provisions of the Public Utility Holding Company Act of 1935 except Section 9(a)(2). (Rel. 35-24389; 35-24390 - May 13)

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## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

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### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the Midwest Stock Exchange (SR-MSE-87-1) that suspends the application of Article XXX, Rule 1-01(I)(6)(c) [Mandatory Posting Rule] for the six-month periods ending June 30, 1986 and December 31, 1986. (Rel. 34-24444)

### NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The National Association of Securities Dealers filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-NASD-87-22) which would amend Section 43 of its Code of Arbitration Procedure and the Board of Governors' Resolution following that section. The amendments modify the schedule of fees required to be deposited by claimants with the NASD at the beginning of the arbitration and modify the amounts ultimately chargeable to the parties by the NASD for the use of the arbitration forum. The amendments also require that respondents held liable by arbitration panels timely pay the appropriate sum to the prevailing party in cash, rather than crediting the prevailing party's account with the dollar amount of the award.

Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of May 11. (Rel. 34-24445)

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## MISCELLANEOUS

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### NOTICE FILED TO CANCEL REGISTRATION

The Commission published a notice of its intention to cancel the registration of John Adams Trust Corporation of Boston, Massachusetts, under Section 203(h) of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. Section 203(h) provides that the Commission shall, by order, cancel the registration of any person registered under Section 203 or who has pending an application for registration under that section if it finds that such person is no longer in existence or is not engaged in business as an investment adviser. The notice gives any interested person until 30 days after the date of this publication to submit to the Commission a written request for a hearing on the matter. (Rel. IA-1070)

Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
