# **COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS**

# LIBRARY

TRANS-CONTINENTAL TRADING CORPORATION, OTHERS ENJOINED

The Boston Regional Office today announced that the Honorable Joseph L. Tauro of the U.S. District Court at Boston on January 21 permanently enjoined Trans-Continental Trading Corporation (TCTCO) and Trans-Continental Management Corporation (TCMCO), both of Waltham, Massachusetts; Zurich International Investments Corporation (Zurich) of Framingham, Massachusetts; Luigi M. DiFonzo, also known as L. M. DiFonzo, Louis DiFonzo, Lou DiFonzo, and Keith Anderson, of Wellesley, Massachusetts; Michael A. DiFonzo, Sr., also known as Michael Michaels, of Framingham, Massachusetts and Tiverton, Rhode Island and Michael Morse, of Los Angeles, California, from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The defendants consented to the entry of the decrees.

The Commission's complaint alleged among other things that the defendants violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in a public distribution of the securities of TCTCO: namely, investment contracts consisting of an opportunity to participate in a common enterprise pursuant to which each investor was solicited to entrust a minimum of \$5,000 to the management of the defendants, who in their sole discretion, employ the investors' capital to purchase and sell commodities' futures. The complaint alleged that misstatements and material omissions were made, concerning, among other things, defendants' expertise in the commodities field; TCTCO's affiliation with acknowledged experts in the fields of economics, international commodities, and currency-trading; and TCTCO's ability to engage in world wide commodities trading. ### COMPLAINT NAMES 3M, OTHERS

The Commission announced that it filed a complaint and consent judgments on January 30 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Minnesota against Minnesota Mining and Manufacturing Company (3M) and three of its officers and directors, Harry Heltzer, Irwin R. Hansen and Bert S. Cross.

The complaint alleged that the defendants violated the proxy rules and reporting provisions of the Exchange Act in the establishment and maintenance of a secret fund for using corporate assets to make unlawful political contributions. The consent judgments enjoin the defendants from using corporate funds for unlawful political contributions or other similar unlawful purposes; from filing periodic reports on proxy solicitations which are materially misleading with respect to such matters; and from making false or fictitious entries on the books and records of 3M, or establishing or maintaining any secret or unrecorded funds of monies other assets or making payments therefrom. The individual defendants are ordered to pay or arrange the payment to 3M, and 3M was ordered to transmit a statement to shareholders describing the facts and circumstances related to the allegations in the Commission's action. In addition, provision has been made for the appointment of a special investigative agent. (SEC v. Minnesota Mining and Manufacturing Co., et al., Civil Action 3-75-29). (LR-6711)

### CARROLL W. WELLS CONVICTED

The SEC announced that on January 24 the Honorable Fred M. Taylor, U.S. District Judge for the District of Idaho, found Carroll W. Wells in criminal contempt of a decree of permanent injunction entered February 16, 1968 by Judge Taylor, enjoining Wells from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of common stock of Nuclear Fuels and Golden Pleasure Mining Company, Inc. The defendant is scheduled to be sentenced February 28, 1975. (U.S. v. Carroll W. Wells, Civil Action No. 1-68-11). (LR-6704)

### COMPLAINT NAMES REPUBLIC ENERGY CORPORATION, OTHERS

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced today the filing of a civil injunctive complaint in Federal District Court at Dallas on January 28 against Republic Energy Corporation, Earth Energies, Inc., E. Carter Bills, II, David M. Dunn, Jr., also known as Dharman Dunn, a/k/a Wayne Carter, Richard T. Harris, a/k/a Murali Harris, Larry L. Ripaldi, Tom R. Rogers, all of Dallas, Texas, McQueen Oil & Gas, Inc. and Gene McQueen, both of Midland, Texas, and H. Bryan Poff of Fort Worth, Texas. The complaint charges violations of the securities registration, antifraud and broker-dealer registration provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of the common stock of Republic and/or fractional undivided working interests in oil and gas leases located in Borden, Eastland, Cooke, Pecos, Schleicher and Winkler Counties, Texas. Federal District Judge Robert W. Porter, Dallas, has set February 18, 1975 as the date for hearing the Commission's motion for a preliminary injunction. (SEC v. Republic Energy Corp., et al., N.D. Tex., Civil Action No. CA3-75-0111F). (LR-6705)

# DEFAULT JUDGMENT ENTERED AGAINST VERN HOFFMAN

The Denver Regional Office announced that on January 13 Judge Robert V. Denney, U.S. District Court for the District of Nebraska, signed an order of judgment of default against Vern Hoffman, permanently enjoining him from violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of fractional undivided interests in oil and gas rights offered by Apollo Oil Company, Inc. The remaining defendants, Apollo Enterprises, Inc., Paul B. Stella, G. E. "Dave" Fuller, Sebasitan Basilico, Adrien Schmidt, and Robert Schell, has earlier consented to a permanent injunction without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint filed on November 25, 1974, by the Securities and Exchange Commission. (Litigation Release Nos. 6619 and 6672). (SEC v. Apollo Enterprises, Inc., U.S.D.C., Nebr. Civil Action No. 74-0-327). (LR-6706)

### INTERSTATE GENERAL, INC., PHILIP WEINKRANTZ ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on January 28 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia permanently enjoined Interstate General, Inc. and Philip Weinkrantz of Dallas, Texas from violating the antifraud and reporting provisions of the securities laws. The injunction arose from a complaint filed by the Commission against Interstate and Weinkrantz and others which alleged that the role of a certain individual as a controlling factor in the acquisition of Savoy Industries, Inc. and the real purpose behind such acquisition was not disclosed to the public. Interstate and Weinkrantz were also enjoined from voting any of the shares of Savoy common stock acquired by them or their nominees in connection with such acquisition. Finally, as part of their consent, Interstate and Weinkrantz have agreed to file with the Commission amended reports fully disclosing the identity and background of all persons involved in the acquisition of the Savoy shares and the purpose behind the acquisition. Interstate and Weinkrantz consented to the injunction without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint. (SEC v. Savoy Industries, Inc., et al., D.D.C. Civil Action No. 74-1711). # CLOYD M. SMITH AND MRS. CLOYD M. SMITH (AKA MARGARITA DESATORRA, ALGUAIRE) ENJOINED

The Denver Regional Office announced that the Honorable Hatfield Chilson, U.S. District Court Judge for the District of Colorado, entered an order of default judgment permanently enjoining Cloyd M. Smith and Mrs. Cloyd M. Smith (aka Margarita DeSatorra, Alguaire) from violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of the common stock of U.S. Beryllium Corporation and Beryllium International, Inc. or any other security. (SEC v. U.S. Beryllium Corporation, et al., U.S.D.C., Colo., Civil Action No. C-4192) (LR-6708)

# ROBERT L. WHISTLER AND FRED L. WHISTLER ENJOINED

The Seattle Regional Office announced that on January 24 the Honorable Ray McNichols, U.S. District Judge for the District of Idaho, permanently enjoined by consent Robert L. Whistler and Fred L. Whistler from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of the common stock of Jan Corporation, Inc. (SEC v. Jan Corporation, Inc., et al. Civil Action No. 4-74-44). (LR-6709)

# TRADING SUSPENSIONS

### FIDELITY MORTGAGE INVESTORS TRADING SUSPENDED

The SEC announced the suspension of exchange and over-the-counter trading in all securities of Fidelity Mortgage Investors, a Massachusetts business trust located in Jacksonville, Florida for a ten-day period beginning on January 31 and terminating at 10:00 a.m. (EST) on February 9, 1975 or earlier if it appears to be in the public interest.

The suspension was initiated at the request of the company and to allow time for investors and shareholders of the company to consider the announcement issued yesterday by Fidelity Mortgage Investors that it had filed a Chapter XI petition for bankruptcy. The Commission notes that the company is delinquent in filing its most recent annual report on Form 10-K and that it has denied a company request for an extension of time to file this report. # INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

### THE MUNICIPAL INCOME FUND, FIRST INSURED DISCOUNT SERIES

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until February 25 to request a hearing on an application filed by The Municipal Income Fund, First Insured Discount Series and Subsequent Series (Funds), registered unit investment trusts, and Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith Incorporated, sponsor of the Funds (Sponsor) (collectively the Applicants), for an order permitting (1) the Funds, unmanaged unit investment trusts, and the Sponsor to make a public offering of Units of the Funds which represent undivided interests in an underlying portfolio of deposited and identified bonds, without having to sell \$100,000 worth of such Units to 25 or fewer investors, (2) the Funds to make monthly distributions of capital gains, the production of which will be substantially independent of action by the Sponsor and the Trustee, instead of being required to hold such gains in cash for annual distribution, and (3) the Sponsor to engage in secondary market operations involving repurchases and resales of the redeemable Units at prices determined through an evaluation made on the last business day of the week in which such secondary market transactions occur. # MOBIL ALASKA PIPELINE COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until February 18 to request a hearing on an application of Mobil Alaska Pipeline Company, a Delaware corporation, for an order exempting it from all provisions of the Act. (Rel. IC-8657 - Jan. 30)

# HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

# CONSOLIDATED NATURAL GAS COMPANY

The SEC has issued an order approving proposals of Consolidated Natural Gas Company (Consolidated), a registered holding company, and Consolidated Gas Supply Corporation and CNG Producing Company, non-utility subsidiaries of Consolidated, pursuant to which (1) Supply Corporation will transfer to Consolidated, and Consolidated will retransfer to CNG Producing, various developed and undeveloped production properties now held by Supply Corporation, and (2) CNG Producing will issue and sell to Consolidated \$10,755,000 of the former's common stock and \$50,000,000 of its long-term non-negotiable notes. (Rel. 35-18792 - Jan. 31)

### UTAH POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

An order has been issued approving a Section 11(e) Plan proposing the divestiture by Utah Power & Light Company, a registered holding company and an electric public utility company, of the utility assets of its single public utility subsidiary company by sale to an unaffiliated purchaser. (Rel. 35-18794 - Jan. 31)

# TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

### PAN AMERICAN WORLD AIRWAYS

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on the application of Pan American World Airways, Inc. that the trusteeship of United States Trust Company of New York under six indentures of Pan Am is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify U.S. Trust from acting as trustee. (Rel. 39-379)
