COMMISSION PROPOSES EXEMPTIVE RULE UNDER ADVISERS ACT

The Commission announced today that it is considering the adoption of new Rule 206(3)-l under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. The purpose of the proposed Rule is to exempt investment advisers who are also registered with the Commission as broker-dealers from the disclosure and consent requirements of Section 206(3) of the Act with respect to certain investment advisory services if such advisers comply with the conditions set forth in the proposed Rule.

Rule 206(3)-l is being proposed at this time because of indications that, as a result of the elimination of fixed commission rates on exchange transactions by May 1, 1975 pursuant to Rule 19b-3 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, some broker-dealers may elect to charge separately for investment advisory services the performance of which is now solely incidental to their brokerage business and without special compensation. The change to charging separately for investment advice would cause such broker-dealers to become "investment advisers" within the meaning of the Act who will then be subject to the Act's provisions, including Section 206(3). That section makes it unlawful for an investment adviser, if he is acting as such in relation to a particular transaction, to effect the transaction with or for his client under circumstances where the adviser acts either as principal, or as broker for a person other than his client, unless the adviser furnishes his client with prior written disclosure of the capacity in which the adviser is acting and obtains the client's consent to the transaction.

In cases where impersonal advisory services are provided by brokerage firms to large numbers of persons, compliance with the requirements of Section 206(3) may often be difficult and may also impede the timely execution of securities transactions which fall within the scope of Section 206(3). Therefore, the Commission proposes to exempt those advisers who are also registered as broker-dealers from the provisions of Section 206(3) in connection with transactions in which investment advice is limited to (1) publicly distributed written materials or publicly made oral statements (i.e., communications which are made to 35 or more persons who pay for them), or (2) responses to specific requests for statistical information where no opinions or estimates are given. The adviser would also be required to state in the communication that if a purchaser of the communication uses the adviser's services to effect a transaction in a security which is the subject of the communication, the adviser may act as principal for its own account or as agent for another person. Such disclosure, however, would not relieve the investment adviser from any other applicable disclosure obligation pursuant to Sections 206(1) and (2) of the Act or other provisions of the federal securities laws.

DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST AND SANCTIONS IMPOSED ON CHASE INVESTMENT SERVICES OF BOSTON, INC., JOHN P. CHASE, INC., AND OTHERS

The Commission announced the institution of public administrative proceedings against Chase Investment Services of Boston, Inc. (CIS), a Boston, Massachusetts investment adviser which manages accounts of clients with accounts of \$25,000 or larger; John P. Chase, Inc. (JPC), CIS's parent and itself an investment adviser which serves larger and wealthier clients and has some \$475 million under management; John P. Chase, Chairman of JPC's Board of Directors and an officer and director of CIS; Lawrence M. Tilton, of Rancho Santa Fe, California, CIS's former president and JPC's former vice-president; and Jack W. Swenson of Sudbury, Massachusetts, JPC's former executive vice-president

and now a registered investment adviser in his own right. The Commission simultaneously issued an order imposing remedial sanctions against respondents, based upon offers of settlement in which respondents, without admitting or denying the charges against them, consented to certain findings and sanctions.

Pursuant to these offers, the Commission found that (A) CIS, Swenson, Tilton and others violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws; and (B) JPC and Chase failed reasonably to supervise with a view toward preventing such violations.

The Commission found that advertisements were distributed and oral sales presentations made to CIS clients which contained untrue and misleading statements relating to, among other things, the similarity between CIS's advisory service to the kind of service furnished by JPC and other investment counsel firms to wealthy investors, the past performance of CIS accounts, and the risks involved in CIS's investment methods.

The Commission also found that investment decisions for CIS clients were made without regard for their suitability to the particular client; client's accounts were not promptly reviewed when material changes occurred in CIS's research positions about securities in such accounts; inducements were offered to broker-dealers to recommend that their customers become clients of CIS, including a share of the advisory fees paid by such clients and the likelihood of substantial brokerage income; and that the foregoing facts were not disclosed to clients or prospective clients of CIS.

The Commission's order: (1) Suspends both CIS and JPC for 180 days from soliciting or accepting new clients for or on behalf of CIS; (2) Requires CIS to serve its existing clients at cost during the aforementioned 180-day suspension period; (3) Suspends Chase himself from association with an investment adviser for 30 days; (4) Suspends both Swenson's registration as an investment adviser and his right to associate himself with any other investment adviser for 30 days (beginning at the opening of business on April 16, 1975); and (5) Precludes Tilton from associating himself with an investment adviser, a broker, or a dealer without the Commission's prior approval.

The Commission's order noted that CIS and JPC have undertaken to institute certain remedial steps for the conduct of CIS's advisory business and that Swenson has made a similar undertaking with respect to his advisory business. (Rel. IR-449)

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

INITIAL DECISION BARS LEO GLASSMAN

Administrative Law Judge Edward B. Wagner has filed an initial decision barring Leo Glassman, 500 East 83rd Street, New York, New York, from association with any broker or dealer, except that after a fifteen month period Glassman may apply to the Commission for reinstatement in a nonproprietary and supervised capacity. The decision is subject to Commission review on petition of a party or on the Commission's own initiative.

The decision is based upon findings that Glassman in 1968-69 wilfully violated the antifraud provisions and during that period and in 1970 wilfully aided and abetted violations of the bookkeeping provisions of the securities laws.

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

APPALACHIAN POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 21 to request a hearing on a proposal of American Electric Power Company, Inc. (AEP) and certain of its subsidiary electric utility companies, (1) for AEP to increase to \$125 million the aggregate amount of cash capital contributions it may make to Indiana & Michigan Electric Company, and (2) for AEP to purchase a total of 750,000 shares of Appalachian Power Company's common stock, \$40 per share, for a total consideration of \$30 million. (Rel. 35-18895 - Mar. 28)

INDIANA & MICHIGAN ELECTRIC COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Indiana & Michigan Electric Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to issue and sell an additional \$1 million of short-term notes to two previously named banks. (Rel. 35-18896 - TMar. 28)

NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM

An order has been issued authorizing New England Electric System (NEES), a registered holding company, and certain of its subsidiary electric utility companies, for the subsidiaries to issue short-term promissory notes to banks and/or NEES, and commercial paper to dealers in commercial paper. (Rel. 35-18897 - Mar. 28)

APPALACHIAN POWER COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Appalachian Power Company (Appalachian), subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to issue and sell up to an additional \$30,460,000 of short-term notes to 34 previously named and 7 other banks, to the limit of the maximum of short-term indebtedness that Appalachian is authorized by the Commission to incur, currently \$175,000,000. Appalachian will use the net proceeds for its past and future construction program. (Rel. 35-18899 - Mar. 28)

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

GULF & WESTERN INDUSTRIES, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 16 to request a hearing on an application by Gulf & Western Industries, Inc. (the Company) under Section 310(b)(l)(ii) of the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 declaring that the trusteeship of Chemical Bank of New York under two indentures of the Company is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify Chemical Bank of New York from acting as trustee.
