# **DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS**

R. BASILE & CO., INC. REVOKED; RICHARD B. BASILE BARRED

The Commission has revoked the broker-dealer registration of R. Basile & Co., Inc., of Bayside, New York, and barred Richard B. Basile, who was its president, from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser or investment company. Basile may, upon a satisfactory showing to the Commission's staff, (1) become associated with a broker-dealer in a non-supervisory and non-proprietary capacity under proper supervision after three months, and (2) after two years as a supervised employee assume a supervisory or proprietary position.

The sanctions were based on findings that the firm and Basile violated the antifraud provisions. The firm participated in distributions of the common stock of Chicken Roost Enterprise, Inc., Orth-O-Vision Incorporated and Pennysaver Home Distribution Corp. but failed to deposit promptly, as required, all of the funds received in separate bank accounts as agent or trustee. It was also found that the firm and Basile failed to comply with the net capital, credit extension, recordkeeping and reporting requirements of the securities laws.

The Commission's action was based on an offer of settlement in which the firm and Basile, without admitting or denying the charges, consented to the indicated findings and sanctions. (Rel. 34-11451)

SEC CITES BRONWEN CORPORATION; PRESIDENT AND OTHERS SANCTIONED

The Commission has instituted administrative proceedings under the Securities Exchange Act against Bronwen Corporation, a Washington, D.C. broker-dealer, James V. Kimsey, its president, Harold C. Barrett, sales manager, Alexander W. Moore, trader, and Jesse E. McLain, Jr., a salesman. At the same time, the Commission accepted offers of settlement from the individual respondents under which it barred Kimsey from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser or investment company, and, effective June 16, suspended Barrett, Moore and McLain from any such association for respective periods of 60 days, 10 business days and 10 business days. After 5 years, Kimsey may apply to the Commission to become so associated in a non-supervisory and non-proprietary position.

The sanctions were based on findings that, during the period April to November 1973, the individual respondents sold common stock of District Photo, Inc. and Publishing Computer Service, Inc. to customers at unfair prices, and made material misstatements concerning the market price of those securities. It was also found that, during the period January 1970 to June 1972, Kimsey participated in a manipulative scheme involving the common stock of Penn Metal Fabricators, Inc. and Montgomery Land Investment and Development Corporation. He effected transactions in those securities designed to restrict the floating supply, raise the market price, and create the false appearance of an active market. In addition, he sold the securities to customers at unfair prices, and made material misstatements concerning the existence of a bona fide independent market for the stocks.

Without admitting or denying the charges against them, the individual respondents consented to the above findings and the indicated sanctions. (Rel. 34-11454)

# **COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS**

# CHARLES F. RAYMOND, OTHERS SENTENCED

The Washington Regional Office announced that on May 20 the Honorable Louis C. Bechtle, U.S. District Court Judge for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, sentenced Charles F. Raymond of Los Angeles, California to 15 months imprisonment, 5 years probation and a fine of \$50,000 in connection with his prior guilty plea to an indictment charging securities fraud, mail fraud and the sale of unregistered securities. David A. Bury of Moorestown, New Jersey and Gilbert J. Sharell of Medford, New Jersey were sentenced to 5 years probation and each received a \$5,000 fine in connection with their guilty pleas to the indictment and to a criminal information charging violations of the registration provisions of the securities laws.

The defendants were indicted on September 19, 1974, wherein they were charged with securities registration and antifraud violations, mail fraud and conspiracy in connection with the sale of unregistered securities, namely interests in oil and gas drilling programs of Westland Minerals Corporation. At the time of sentencing various counts of the indictment to which guilty pleas were not entered were dismissed. (U.S. v. Charles F. Raymond, et al., U.S.D.C., E.D. Pa., Crim. No. 74-551). # INDICTMENT CHARGES PORTLAND-AREA SECURITIES FRAUD

On May 29, a federal grand jury at Portland, Oregon, returned a 31-count indictment against Frank S. Morris, Donald Riddell, Frances Nitsch and Robert Lind, all of Portland, Oregon. On the same day, the grand jury returned a separate 13-count indictment against Donald Riddell, arising from similar conduct with his own company. The defendants are charged with fraud in the sale of securities, sale of unregistered securities, mail fraud, and conspiracy. The two indictments alleged a scheme to offer and sell to investors in several states, including Oregon, Washington and California, unregistered securities described as evidences of indebtedness in the form of contracts of sale of collateral, which included truck tires, truck tractors and truck trailers. The indictment alleges that defendants, in connection with the sale of securities, employed misrepresentations and omissions regarding, among other things, the bona-fide sale of collateral, the existence of such collateral, the genuineness of the agreement and the source of monthly payments paid to investors. (U.S. v. Frank S. Morris, et al., U.S.D.C., Ore., CR-75-144). (LR-6924)

COMPLAINT NAMES THE CHRISTIAN AND MISSIONARY ALLIANCE FOUNDATION, INC.

The SEC announced the filing of a complaint on May 30 in the U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Florida at Tampa, Florida, seeking to permanently enjoin The Christian and Missionary Alliance Foundation, Inc., (Foundation) from violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws in connection with the offer and sale of note certificates by the Foundation.

On June 2, 1975, the Honorable Ben Krentzman, U.S. District Judge, entered an order of permanent injunction prohibiting future violations of the foregoing provisions by the Foundation in connection with the offer and sale of its note certificates or any other security. The order of permanent injunction was entered based upon the consent of the Foundation, which neither admitted or denied the allegations of the Commission's complaint. (SEC v. The Christian and Missionary Alliance Foundation, Inc., M.D. Fla., Civ. Action No. 75-26-Ft. M.K.). (LR-6925)

(Second Congress), both mutual funds, and Fidelity Management & Research Company (Fidelity), the investment adviser to, and a shareholder of, Congress and Second Congress, for an order of the Commission permitting a proposed merger of Second Congress into Congress and the participation therein of Fidelity and another shareholder of Second Congress.
