NASD PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission has published for public comment, pursuant to Section 19(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (the Act), proposed rule changes filed by the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. on March 21, 1975 and June 4, 1975, relating to trading in eligible listed securities, as defined in the joint industry plan filed with and declared effective by the Commission pursuant to Rule 17a-15 under the Act (the Plan), and the reporting by NASD members of transactions in such securities in the consolidated transaction reporting system as described in the Plan. The Commission particularly wishes to receive comments on the NASD rule changes governing the reporting charges to be collected from NASD members, both as to the amount thereof and the manner in which those charges are to be levied. Comments on the proposal are requested to be submitted on or before June 30, 1975, and should refer to File No. SR-1.

The Commission has also ordered, under Section 19(b)(3)(B) of the Act, that the proposed NASD reporting and anti-manipulative rules regarding transactions in eligible securities be put into effect summarily, effective June 16, 1975, until such time as the Commission either approves the NASD proposals or institutes proceedings to determine whether such rules should be disapproved. COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

COMMISSION ACTION IN TWO REQUESTS UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT

The Commission announced its decisions in two separate appeals of determinations of requests for records pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

The Commission denied the request of Jeffrey B. Albert, Esquire, for access to certain internal memoranda included in the Commission's investigatory file relating to Photon, Inc. The Commission's decision was based on the exemptions provided by the FOIA for investigatory records and for intra-agency memoranda. (Rel. FOIA-10)

The Commission partially granted the request under the FOIA of John A. Jenkins. Mr. Jenkins had appealed the denial of his request for copies of staff memoranda written since January 1, 1974 upon which Commission investigations were closed (whether or not any enforcement action was taken as a result of that investigation) and copies of letters written during the same period notifying subjects of Commission investigations that an investigation had been closed. The Commission granted Mr. Jenkins access to staff memoranda recommending the closing of investigations where enforcement action had been completed, subject to the deletion of details the disclosure of which would be an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of persons named in the memoranda. Access was denied to memoranda closing any investigation which did not result in any Commission enforcement action and to letters notifying subjects of Commission investigations of the closing of the investigation. Such materials are deemed exempt from disclosure by virtue of the exemptions for intraagency memoranda and for investigatory materials the disclosure of which would constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. The Commission determined, however, to furnish Mr. Jenkins with a list of investigations closed without enforcement action showing the dates each investigation was opened and closed, the sections of the securities laws involved, and the reason the investigation was closed. COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER RE HERMANN MAYERS, OTHERS EXTENDED

The SEC announced that on May 30 the Honorable John H. Pratt, U.S. District Judge for the District of Columbia, entered a temporary restraining order enjoining Hermann Mayer, Dan Mayer, Refrax Handels Anstalt, Sanbil Handels Anstalt, Magnesit Holding A.G., Aldo Handels Anstalt and, among others, certain named agents from purchasing, selling, voting or otherwise acquiring, disposing of or encumbering any securities of General Refractories Company. The above individuals and companies were all named as defendants in the Commission's injunctive action filed on May 21, 1975. Judge Pratt's order was extended by Judge Smith on June 9, 1975, for an additional ten-day period and expires at 10:00 a.m. on June 19, 1975.

NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY
