DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

LIBRARY

GEORGE J. MEYER, II SANCTIONED

The Commission has suspended George J. Meyer, II, of Milwaukee, from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser or investment company for 30 days beginning July 28, 1975, and barred him thereafter from such association in a supervisory capacity except for sales or research personnel.

The sanction imposed was based on findings that Meyer aided and abetted violations of the reporting and recordkeeping provisions of the Exchange Act. It was also found that he was an officer and director of a broker-dealer for which a trustee was appointed under the Securities Investor Protection Act.

Without admitting or denying the charges against him, Meyer consented to the above findings and sanction. (Rel. 34-11541)

LINK, GORMAN, PECK & CO. SUSPENDED; PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT SANCTIONED

The Commission has suspended the registration of Link, Gorman, Peck & Co. of Chicago, Illinois, as a broker-dealer for 10 business days. It has also suspended the firm's president, Wilbur A. Gorman, for 6 months, and its vice president, June E. Carlson, for 60 days from association with any broker, dealer, investment company or investment adviser. After his suspension, Gorman will be barred from any such association, except as a supervised employee in a non-supervisory or non-proprietary capacity. Carlson will be barred after her suspension from supervising any such entity's back office operations. The suspensions begin to run on July 28, 1975.

The sanctions were based on findings that the registrant aided and abetted by the individual respondents violated the financial responsibility, bookkeeping and reporting provisions of the Securities Exchange Act.

Respondents consented to the findings and sanctions in the order without admitting or denying the charges against them, and solely to settle the proceedings. (Rel. 34-11542)

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

STANDARD PRUDENTIAL CORPORATION ORDER AMENDED

The Commission announced that on July 8 Judge Aubrey E. Robinson, U.S. District Judge for the District of Columbia, entered an amendment to the judgment and order of permanent injunction and ancillary relief in SEC v. Standard Prudential Corporation, et al., (S-P). According to the amendment, S-P's committee of three persons whose task, among others, is to prepare a plan within thirty days after its formation for the disposal of a block of shares of Talcott National Corporation presently held by Talcorp, Inc., shall consist of two independent directors of S-P and one person who may be affiliated with one of S-P's subsidiaries.

The Commission on July 15, 1975, has assented to the composition of the committee, signifying commencement as of such date of the thirty-day period in which the committee is to prepare a plan for disposal of Talcott National Corporation's stock held by Talcorp, Inc. (SEC v. Standard Prudential Corp., et al., D.D.C.). (LR-7001)

ALAN R. CARP ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on July 18 Judge Howard F. Corcoran, U.S. District Court Judge for the District of Columbia, entered a judgment in SEC v. Sanitas Service Corporation, et al., permanently enjoining defendant Alan R. Carp from violating the anti-

fraud, reporting and proxy solicitation provisions of the securities laws by issuing and disseminating and causing Sanitas to issue and disseminate to shareholders and the investing public and causing to be filed with the Commission false and misleading annual and periodic reports, proxy materials, press releases, registration statements and prospectuses. In addition, Alan R. Carp has been permanently enjoined from using corporate funds of Sanitas or any other company, or aiding and abetting the use of such funds for political payments, bribes, kickbacks or other similar unlawful purposes.

Alan R. Carp consented to the entry of the judgment of permanent injunction without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint. (SEC v. Sanitas Service Corp., et al., D.D.C.). (LR-7002)

He has argued numerous appellate cases on behalf of the Commission, including cases before the U.S. Supreme Court, and in recent years has been primarily responsible for handling legislative matters.
