COMMISSION ADOPTS RULES FOR INCREASED DISCLOSURE OF INTERIM RESULTS BY REGISTRANTS AND PROPOSES AMENDED LIBRARY DATA

The Commission today issued a rule which requires increased disclosure in Form 10-Q reports and disclosure of selected quarterly data in annual financial statements of certain registrants.

The amendments to Form 10-Q substantially increase the content of quarterly reports. These requirements include condensed financial statements, a narrative analysis of the results of operations, the approval of any accounting change by the registrant's independent public accountant, and the signature of the registrant's chief financial officer or chief accounting officer. In addition, the revised form permits additional financial disclosures deemed appropriate by management, and permits the registrant state that financial data in the form has been reviewed by independent public accountants when such a review has been made in accordance with professional standards. In addition, there may be included as an exhibit to the form a letter from the independent public accountant in regard to this review.

The amendments to Regulation S-X have been adopted substantially as proposed but include exemptive criteria which limit applicability of the amendments. The limitation is based on trading interest and size. In this regard, listed companies and NASDAQ companies meeting the Federal Reserve Board's Regulation T criteria for OTC margin stock have been included and other companies exempted. Of the companies so included, the rule also exempts any registrant which did not have income (before extraordinary items and accounting changes) of at least \$250,000 for each of the last three years and whose total assets were less than \$200 million at its most recent fiscal year end.

The Regulation S-X amendments require disclosure in a note to the annual financial statements of certain registrants of net sales, gross profit (net sales less costs and expenses associated directly with or allocated to products sold or services rendered), income before extraordinary items and cumulative effect of a change in accounting, per share data based upon such income, and net income for each quarter within the two most recent fiscal years and any subsequent fiscal period for which income statements are presented. Where this note is part of audited financial statements, it may be designated as "unaudited," but the release recognizes that auditors will be associated with the data.

In addition, the releases explicitly recognize the desirability of having auditing standards and procedures developed in the private sector by the accounting profession. The adopted rules which mandate retrospective auditor involvement in the interim reporting process of certain registrants and permit and encourage timely involvement refer only to the auditor following "appropriate professional standards and procedures" with respect to the data. The Commission has re-proposed a list of standards and procedures for the auditor to follow in order to provide protection to auditors but states if the Auditing Standards Executive Committee of the AICPA develops satisfactory standards and procedures it intends to rely upon such standards and expects to withdraw its proposals.

The amendments to Regulation S-X will be applicable to financial statements for all fiscal periods beginning subsequent to December 25, 1974, but in no event shall disclosure of quarterly data be required for quarters beginning prior to that date. The amendments to Form 10-Q will be effective for reports filed for periods beginning after December 25, 1975.

The re-proposed review procedures, if not withdrawn, would be expected to be made effective for filings made with the Commission for all fiscal periods beginning subsequent to December 25, 1975. All interested persons are invited to submit written comments to the proposals on or before November 15, 1975. The communications should be addressed to the Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, Washington, D.C. 20549 and should be referred to File No. S7-542. All comments will be available for public inspection. The adopted rules are in Release 33-5611. The proposed rules setting forth review procedures are in Release 33-5612.

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

COMMISSION ACTION ON FOIA REQUEST

The Commission today denied the appeal of Robert M. Smith from the denial of his request under the Freedom of Information Act for access to information concerning payments to foreign officials, foreign government executives and foreign political parties or organizations by Lockheed Aircraft Corporation.

At the present time, the Commission is investigating these payments by Lockheed, and thus there is the possibility of future enforcement proceedings. Since those persons who have thus far given information to the Commission have done so in the belief that the investigation was private, public disclosure of the requested records at this time might jeopardize the Commission's chances of obtaining more information.

Under these circumstances, the Commission held that the records requested by Mr. Smith were exempt under the seventh exemption of the Freedom of Information Act since disclosure would tend to "interfere with pending or prospective enforcement proceedings." See, 5 U.S.C. 522(b) (7) (A) and Commission Rule 17 CFR 200.80(b) (7) (A). (FOIA-27)

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

OPINION AND ORDER APPOINTING RECEIVER ENTERED AGAINST HERITAGE TRUST COMPANY

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on August 27 the U.S. District Court in Phoenix, Arizona, entered an order granting the Commission's motion for the appointment of a receiver for Heritage Trust Company of Phoenix, Arizona. Earlier, on July 1, 1975, the Court had denied the Commission's motion for the appointment of a receiver, and instead entered an injunctive order against the defendants. After rehearing the Commission's motion on August 15, 1975, the Court determined that a receiver is necessary and appropriate and indicated, in an opinion accompanying the order, that "no injunction which the Court could frame would cure for the past or prevent in the future the mismanagement and illegalities found in the operation of the defendant Heritage . . ." (SEC v. Heritage Trust Company, et al., U.S.D.C., Az. Civil Action No. 74-519 Phx.-WPC). (LR-7075)

CHRISTIAN E. NELSON ENJOINED

The SEC announced that on August 25 U.S. District Judge Henry F. Werker of the Southern District of New York permanently enjoined Christian E. Nelson (Nelson), former president and chairman of the board of National Beryllia Corp. (NBC), from violating the reporting and antifraud provisions of the securities laws by making false statements of material facts or omitting to state material facts concerning, among other things, the earnings and financial condition of NBC. Nelson consented to the entry of the judgment without admitting or denving the allegations of the Commission's complaint which was filed on November 12, 1974. The Commission's complaint charged that Nelson negligently participated in a plan of concealment from the company's independent auditors of NBC's actual financial condition and failed to instruct NBC employees to make full disclosure of NBC's independent auditors in connection with the material overstatement of NBC's revenues and profits for the year 1972. (SEC v. National Beryllia Corp., et al., S.D.N.Y., 74 Civ. 4949 HFW). (LR-7078)

REGA, OTHERS ENJOINED

The New York Regional Office announced that on August 20 Judge Lawrence W. Pierce of the Southern District of New York filed a final order permanently enjoining the following defendants from violations of the securities laws: Joseph Rega, Jr. (Rega); Christian Paine & Co., Inc. (Christian Paine), formerly a New Jersey broker-dealer of which Rega was president; Carlton-Cambridge & Co., Inc. (Carlton-Cambridge), formerly a Hasbrouck Heights, New Jersey broker-dealer, of which Rega was president; Ross W. Pascall, Louis Levine, Bernard Colloff, Joseph Corvino and Harold Weinberg, all of

whom were formerly employed by Carlton-Cambridge and Christian Paine; and Bernard J. Coven, an attorney practicing in New York City. Another defendant, Robert B. Levin, had previously consented, without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations, to the entry of a permanent injunction. The Court dismissed the complaint as to the final defendant, the Republic National Bank of New York.

As a result of the defendants' activities in connection with the public offering and aftermarket trading in the common stock of Dennison Personnel Inc., the Court found violations of the registration, antifraud and net capital provisions of the securities laws. The Court found that there was a reasonable likelihood of future violations and that the issuance of an injunction was appropriate. (SEC v. Joseph Rega, Jr., et al., 73 Civil 2944 S.D.N.Y. July 3, 1975). (LR-7079)

(IDS), and IDS, the investment adviser and principal underwriter of ISA, for an order of the Commission exempting from the provisions of Section 17(a) of the Act the proposed sale by IDS to ISA of a \$12 million note of the Equitable Life Holding Corporation guaranteed by The Equitable Life Assurance Society of the United States.
