CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

JURY FINDS JOHN NAYLOR CLARK, III LIABLE FOR INSIDER TRADING

On April 3, a Seattle, Washington jury found in an action brought by the Commission that James N. Clark, III, illegally purchased stock of Affiliated Hospital Products, Inc. when he knew his employer, Smith & Nephew Associated Companies, plc, was negotiating to buy the company at a price at least 50% above the current market price of the stock. The jury also found that Clark's broker, Russell G. Van Moppes, through whom the stock purchase was made and who also purchased, was not liable for insider trading.

The Commission charged that these purchases violated antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 because Clark had bought the stock while in possession of material nonpublic information provided to him by his employer with the expectation that he would maintain its confidentiality and not use it for personal gain.

The trial judge, the Honorable Thomas S. Zilly, ordered Clark to disgorge \$57,025.82 representing the profits realized by Clark, his wife, and Van Moppes. Judge Zilly also enjoined Clark from further violation of antifraud provisions for five years and took under advisement the Commission's request for imposition of a penalty under the Insider Trading Sanctions Act of 1984 pending receipt of evidence of Clark's financial situation. (SEC v. John Naylor Clark, III and Russell G. Van Moppes, WDMA, Civil Action No. 87-711). (LR-12056)

L. McDONALD SCHETKY ENJOINED, OTHER RELIEF ORDERED

The U.S. District Court for the District of Connecticut entered a Final Judgment against L. McDonald Schetky, the remaining defendant in a previously instituted action for Injunctive and Other Relief. In its Complaint, the Commission alleged, among other things, that Schetky, while president of Memory Metals, Inc., signed and caused the filing with the Commission of two registration statements and the issuance of private placement selling materials and press releases containing untrue or misleading statements that he sold certain of his Memory Metals stock while in possession of material non-public information. The Court permanently enjoined Schetky from violating antifraud and ownership reporting provisions and from aiding and abetting violations of periodic reporting provisions of the securities laws. The Court ordered Schetky to make disgorgement of profits. Schetky, who also released claims for indemnification and contribution against Memory Metals, consented to the Final Judgment without admitting or denying the Complaint's allegations. (SEC v. Memory Metals, Inc. and L. McDonald Schetky, USDC DCT, Civil Action No. B-89-089, WWE). (LR-12057)

ACTION FILED AGAINST FRANK R. GRILLO, OTHERS IN REGIONAL FUNDING CORP. OFFERING

The New York Regional today filed a civil injunctive action in the District of New Jersey against Frank R. Grillo, Lawrence G. Zuliani, and Anthony R. Defelice, formerly associated with Walter Capital Corp., an inactive broker-dealer. The Complaint, which also seeks an accounting and disgorgement, alleges that Grillo orchestrated a scheme through which Zuliani and Defelice made fraudulent representations during the \$1.5 million initial public offering of common stock of Regional Funding Corporation in 1984, in violation of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws.

The Complaint alleges that customers who purchased the securities were induced to disregard specific statements in the prospectus about the risky and speculative nature of the investment, and also were told baseless predictions about future earnings, future price behavior, and aftermarket liquidity of the shares. (SEC v. Frank R. Grillo, et al., DNJ, Civil Action No. 89-1453). (LR-12058)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE MINNESOTA MUTUAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 26 to request a hearing on an application filed by The Minnesota Mutual Life Insurance Company, Minnesota Mutual Variable Life Account, and MIMLIC Sales Corporation (together, Applicants), for an order granting exemptions from the provisions of Section 27(a)(3) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 6e-2(b)(13)(ii) to permit Applicants to eliminate the 7% sales load imposed on unscheduled or "nonrepeating" premium payments under certain scheduled premium variable life insurance contracts issued by the Account. The order would amend the portion of an existing order [Rel. IC-15523, January 7, 1987] exempting Applicants from Section 27(a)(3) and Rule 6e-2(b)(13)(ii). (Rel. IC-16902 - Apr. 4)

THE RBB FUND, INC.

An order has been issued on an application filed by The RBB Fund, Inc. and Planco Financial Services, Inc. approving certain exchange offers. (Rel. IC-16903 - Apr. 5)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

GENERAL PUBLIC UTILITIES CORPORATION

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by General Public Utilities Corporation (GPU), a registered holding company, to initially issue, through December 31, 1998, pursuant to an exception from the competitive bidding requirements, and subsequently reacquire, up to 20,000 shares of GPU common stock under a Restricted Stock Plan for Outside Directors (Plan), which is to be adopted, subject to certain restrictions, as further compensation for members of GPU's Board of Directors who are Outside Directors. The Plan is to be administered by a Committee. Outside Directors are to be awarded 100 shares of GPU common stock, or a portion thereof, with respect to service in 1989 and, beginning in 1990, in such other amounts as determined by the Board upon recommendation of the Committee. GPU has also been authorized to solicit proxies for the 1989 Annual Meeting of its shareholders to be held on or about May 3 in connection with requesting shareholder approval of the Plan. Subject to approval, the Plan would be effective as of January 1. (Rel. 35-24851 - Mar. 30)
