CARREL APPLICATIONS NOW BEING ACCEPTED

Pursuant to the rules of the Public Reference Room, the July allocation of carrels and telephone privileges for recognized user organizations (information dissemination companies) are now being accepted. Application forms are available in the Public Reference Room. Information dissemination companies that are unable to pick up forms in Washington may submit applications by writing to April Keyes, Branch Chief, Public Reference, Securities and Exchange Commission, Room 1024, Mail Stop 1-2, 450 Fifth Street, NW, Washington, DC 20549. Applications must include: a brief description of the business, business address and telephone number, the name of a person who will serve as on-site contact in the Room, and the names of all persons who work every day in the Room, number of employees assigned to research/sales of SEC filings regardless of work locations, and number of carrels requested. Applicants may also submit a supplemental statement in support of their request for carrel/telephone privileges. The applications must be certified and signed by a responsible company official, and submitted by the close of business June 29, 1990. As in the past, assignment of carrels/telephone privileges is discretionary and applicants should not assume they will receive use of the full number of carrels for which they apply. The Commission intends to continue to reserve carrels for the general public.

Revised carrel allocations will be effective July 30, 1990.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES ROSEMARY GRADY, OTHERS

The Atlanta Regional and Miami Branch Offices announced the filing of a Complaint, on June 1, against Rosemary Grady (Grady), Richard C. Avon (Avon), John P. Kyreakakis (Kyreakakis) and Guinness Capital Funding, Inc. (Guinness). The Complaint seeks to enjoin the defendants from further violations of the registration, antifraud, broker-

dealer and recordkeeping provisions of the federal securities laws, and to obtain an accounting and disgorgement of all proceeds received pursuant to the scheme. The Commission alleges that Amerimutual Corporation (Amerimutual), a broker-dealer registered with the Commission from October 1984 until February 1990, through Grady, engaged in a scheme to defraud the investing public by manipulating the trading prices of various securities. The Complaint also alleges that Grady directly engaged in the scheme to defraud investors and caused registered representatives employed at Amerimutual to also engage in this fraudulent course of conduct. The Complaint further alleges that Avon was aware of and actively participated in the fraudulent scheme.

The Complaint alleges that Kyreakakis, the president and director of Guinness, purchased 12.5% of the Guinness initial public offering and immediately resold the securities in the aftermarket for a 200% profit. [SEC v. Rosemary Grady, Richard C. Avon, John P. Kyreakakis, and Guinness Capital Fundings, Inc., Civil Action No. 90-8227-CIV-MARCUS, USDC, SD FL.] (LR-12509)

JOHN E. PARIGIAN PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Boston Regional Office announced that, on May 21, U.S. District Judge Douglas P. Woodlock, District of Massachusetts, entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against John E. Parigian (Parigian). The Order enjoins Parigian from violating or aiding and abetting violations of the antifraud, books and records, internal controls and periodic reporting provisions of the Securities Exchange Act. Parigian is also enjoined from violating Exchange Act rules concerning falsification of records and misleading an issuer's accountants.

Parigian consented to the injunction without admitting or denying the allegations contained in the Complaint. The Complaint alleged that Parigian, former Treasurer and Director of Capitol Bancorporation and of its subsidiary, Capitol Bank and Trust Company, aided and abetted Capitol Bancorporation's filing of false and misleading quarterly reports for the second and third quarters of 1986. The reports allegedly materially overstated operating results due to a failure to establish sufficient loan loss reserves and adequately to disclose trading losses. [SEC v. John E. Parigian, USDC MA., No. 90-11287-WD] (LR-12510)

COMPLAINT NAMES BRUCE BLACK

The New York Regional Office announced that, on June 13, the Commission filed a civil injunctive action in federal court in Brooklyn against Bruce Black (Black) of Wantagh, New York, seeking a permanent injunction, disgorgement and an accounting, arising from Black's violations of Sections 5(a) and 17(a) of the Securities Act, Sections 15(a)(1) and 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act and related Rule 10b-5. The Complaint alleges that from May 1988 through April 1989, Black misappropriated approximately \$2,028,407 from customers who had given Black money to invest in various securities, and from January 1989 through March 1989, obtained approximately \$300,000 through the fraudulent sale of unregistered securities. The Complaint also alleges that in or around April 1989, Black aided and abetted violations of the broker-dealer registration provisions by D.L. Cabot & Co., Inc., an entity Black co-founded, which operated as an unregistered broker-dealer. The litigation is pending. [SEC v. Bruce Black, 90 Civ. 1988 (JBW), EDNY, June 13, 1990] (LR-12511)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

WILLIAM ROBERT METTE' SENTENCED

The Atlanta Regional and Miami Branch Offices announced that, on May 29, the Honorable William Castagna, U.S. District Judge for the Middle District of Florida, sentenced William Robert Mette' (Mette') of Seminole, Florida, to serve a term of imprisonment of three months followed by five years probation in connection with Mette's adjudication of criminal contempt based on unregistered sales of securities. As a part of his probation, Mette' is required to perform 100 hours of community service each year for five years. Judge Castagna waived imposition of a fine based on Mette's financial condition.

On March 26, 1990, Mette' was found guilty of criminal contempt in connection with unregistered sales of the common stock of Centuri Mining Corporation, Inc., in violation of a Final Judgment entered against Mette' in SEC v. Belton, et al., Case No. 87-1890-CIV-13C (MD FL.). Centuri, a Florida corporation, purportedly owns the mineral rights to property located in Colombia, S.A. [United States v. William Robert Mette', Case No. 89-30-CR-T-15B, MD FL.] (LR-12508)
