- (2) Consideration of whether to approve staff recommendations which would temporarily suspend the requirements to use current prices in applying the ceiling test under the full cost accounting method. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

MILITARY ROBOT STOP ORDER ISSUED

The Commission issued a stop order suspending the effectiveness of a registration statement filed under the Securities Act by Military Robot Corporation (MRC), of Buckhannon, West Virginia. The statement covers a proposed public offering of 5,000,000 shares of the company's common stock at a penny a share.

In determining that a stop order should be issued, the Commission found that the sales projections in MRC's registration statement were materially misleading; that there was no reasonable basis for MRC's claim that it could succeed with about one-half the usual administrative and general overhead expense associated with government contracts; and that the financial statement contained in MRC's registration statement was not audited, as required. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

DANNY NEW, OTHERS ENJOINED

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on March 31 U.S. District Judge Dudley H. Brown, Jr., Southern District of Georgia, entered Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction against Danny S. New, David K. New, Fletcher D. Jones and Ronnie Smith, all of Vidalia, Georgia. Both News and Jones are former officers and directors of Vidalia Sweets Brand, Inc. and Smith is a former salesman. Each consented to the Final Judgments without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint. The defendants are permanently enjoined from violating, directly or indirectly, the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the antifraud, books and records, and reports of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

The complaint alleged the filing of a false and misleading Form 10-K for 1984 in order to conceal the spoilage of assets, namely onions, the filing of late and misleading Form 8-Ks, and making false statements to the company's outside auditors during the preparation of the company's financial statements. Injunctive relief was also granted against further violations of the antifraud provisions even though no actual purchases and sales of the company's common stock occurred after the filing of the false reports since their past conduct posed a threat of such violations in the future. (SEC v. Vidalia Sweets Brand, Inc., et al., Civil Action No. CV686-33, USDC SDGA). (LR-11072)

DONALD SHELDON GROUP INC., OTHERS ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on April 10 Judge Peter K. Leisure, U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, entered an order of permanent injunction against Donald Sheldon Group Inc. (Group), a holding company, Donald Sheldon & Co. Inc. (Company), formerly a registered broker-dealer now in a SIPC receivership, and Donald Sheldon Government Securities Inc. (Government), formerly a government securities dealer now in bankruptcy. The injunction permanently enjoins them from violations of the antifraud and net capital provisions of the securities laws and provides for other equitable relief. Group, Company and Government consented to the injunction without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's July 30, 1985 complaint. (SEC v. Donald Sheldon Group Inc., et al., 85 Civil 5829 [PKL] SDNY). (LR-11074)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

GENERAL PUBLIC UTILITIES CORPORATION

An order has been issued regarding General Public Utilities Corporation (GPU), a registered holding company, and its subsidiary, GPU Service Corporation, authorizing the issuance by the subsidiary of \$32 million of long-term notes and the guarantee thereof by GPU. (Rel. 35-24069 - April 24)

An order has been issued granting the application of the New York Stock Exchange to strike the common stock, \$2.50 par value; \$2.40 convertible preferred stock; 4-1/2% convertible subordinated debentures, due August 1, 1987; and 7-1/2% sinking fund debentures, due April 15, 1994; of SYBRON CORPORATION from listing and registration thereon. ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (SR-NASD-86-9) to amend Article III, Section I of its Rules of Fair Practice to allow NASD members to charge a second and final surcharge and an additional fee to issuers in connection with proxy solicitations in order that direct and indirect start-up costs and ongoing costs incurred may be recouped. Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
