COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

INTERPRETATIVE RELEASE ON THE EFFECT OF CREDIT CONTROLS
ON THE OPERATIONS OF CERTAIN REGISTERED INVESTMENT COMPANIES
INCLUDING MONEY MARKET FUNDS

The Commission announced the issuance of a general statement of policy concerning the implications under the securities laws of credit control regulations applicable to certain registered investment companies, including money market funds, which were recently adopted by the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System pursuant to the Credit Control Act of 1969, as implemented by Executive Order of the President. The statement is intended to provide companies and their directors and sponsors (in the case of unit investment trusts) with guidance respecting various disclosure obligations under the Securities Act of 1933 and various regulatory matters under the Investment Company Act of 1940. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PHILADELPHIA STOCK EXCHANGE CENSURED

The Commission announced the issuance of an Order instituting administrative proceedings pursuant to Section 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Findings and Order of the Commission against The Philadelphia Stock Exchange, Inc. (Phlx), a registered national securities exchange located in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The Phlx, under the terms of its Offer of Settlement, consented to the entry of the Findings, Order, and Remedial Sanctions of the Commission without admitting or denying the facts or findings contained therein.

In its Order, the Commission found that the Phlx violated Section 11A(c)(1) of the Exchange Act, the Commission's quotation rule, and also violated Section 19(g) of the Exchange Act by its failure without reasonable justification or excuse, to enforce compliance by its members and persons associated with its members with (1) the Commission's quotation rule and the exchange's own quotation reporting rule; (2) the exchange's options position limit rule; (3) the exchange's option spread parameter rules; and (4) the exchange's rules regarding registered options traders quarterly trading requirements.

In its Order, the Commission censured the Phlx and ordered it to fully comply with certain undertakings made in its Offer of Settlement. In its undertakings, among other things, the Phlx represented that it has made and has undertaken to make, extensive revision in organizational structure, personnel, commitment of resources, programs, policies and procedures designed to strengthen its market surveillance and enforcement capabilities. CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

PETER S. DAVIS FINED

The New York Regional Office announced that on February 28 Peter S. Davis, formerly General Counsel of TDA Industries, Inc., was fined \$5,000 by the Honorable Charles S. Haight, Jr., U.S. District Judge for the Southern District of New York, based on Davis' plea of guilty to one count of conspiracy and one count of securities fraud. (U.S. v. Douglas P. Fields, et al., S.D.N.Y., 76 Cr. 1022). (LR-9034)

ALAN E. SANDBERG SENTENCED

The New York Regional Office announced that on March 6 Alan E. Sandberg of East Northport, New York, a former officer and director of TDA Industries, Inc., was sentenced by the Honorable Inzer B. Wyatt, U.S. District Judge for the Southern District of New York, following his conviction on January 22, 1980 on two counts of mail fraud and one count of wire fraud. Sandberg was sentenced to six weeks imprisonment on each of three counts, to run concurrently, and to be served on 14 weekends. Sandberg was also fined \$1,000 on each of three counts. The criminal trial arose out of a related Commission injunctive action, SEC v. TDA Industries, Inc., et al., 75 Civil 4519 [S.D.N.Y. 1975]. (U.S. v. Frederick M. Friedman and Alan E. Sandberg, S.D.N.Y., 76 Cr. 1022). (LR-9035)
