## U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

### PROPOSED RULES 14 AND 15

The Commission has issued a release giving interested persons until September 2 to comment on proposed Rules 14 and 15 under the Public Utility Holding Company Act of 1935, which would provide exemptions relating to the acquisition and ownership by electric utility companies of interests in generation or transmission subsidiary companies. Comments should be submitted in triplicate to George A. ### PROPOSED RULE 72(b)

## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

---

### HEINICKE INSTRUMENTS COMPANY, INC. ENJOINED; STIPULATION ENTERED AGAINST ROLF G. FRANZ

The Atlanta Regional Office and the Miami Branch Office announced that on July 10 the Honorable Norman C. Roettger entered a Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Heinicke Instruments Company, Inc. enjoining Heinicke from violations of the periodic filing and proxy provisions of the securities laws.

The Final judgment provided for the establishment of a compensation committee and an acquisition committee. Heinicke was further ordered to file Form 8-K, setting forth certain details regarding matters alleged by the Commission in its complaint.

With respect to defendant Rolf G. Franz, the Commission and Franz entered into a stipulation dismissing the complaint against Franz, without prejudice. Pursuant to said stipulation, an order was entered by the court dismissing the complaint as to Franz. (SEC v. Heinicke Instruments Company, Inc., et al., S.D. Fla., Civil Action No. 79-6265-CIV-NCR).
