COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

REORGANIZATION OF THE OFFICE OF DATA PROCESSING

The rapidly changing nature of the Commission's automated data processing (ADP) activities has necessitated a reorganization of the Office of Data Processing, and its redesignation as the Office of Information Systems Management (ISM). The Office will continue under the direction of John D. Adkins, with Thomas J. Whalen, Jr. continuing as Deputy Director. In the new organizational structure, special groups have been established for securities industry information systems, including the Market Oversight and Surveillance System, and ADP user relations. The Branch of Systems Support, which is responsible for all activities relating to the research, installation, and processing of both software and hardware resources, has been redesignated the Branch of Systems Technology, and will continue to be headed by Richard B. Hunt. Existing applications development branches directed by Richard T. Redfearn and Karen K. Holt will be unaffected by the reoganization.
