RULE PROPOSALS AND ADOPTIONS

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO REGISTRATION AND REPORTING FORMS AND REGULATION S-X. The Commission today published proposed amendments of certain of the instructions pertaining to financial statements, summaries of operations and exhibits in registration forms S-1, S-7, S-8, S-9, S-11, 10, 12, and reporting forms 8-K, 10-K, 11-K, 12-K and U5S, and of a related section of Regulation S-X.

The proposed amendments will conform the terminology in the instructions in the forms to that recently adopted in Regulation S-X; will correct references in the instructions to recently changed rule numbers in Regulation S-X; will provide clarifications and modifications of the instructions and the pertinent section of Regulation S-X; and will effect consistency among similar requirements in various forms.

All interested persons are invited to submit comments in writing to the Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, Washington, D.C. 20549, on or before September 14, 1973. (Rel. 33-5405)

DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDING

SCHNEIDER, OSNESS AND GAMMON SANCTIONED. The SEC has barred Roger William Osness and Wayne Howard Gammon, both of Las Vegas, Nevada, from association with any broker-dealer, Bernadine Catherine Schneider, Las Vegas, Nevada, from such association as a principal or supervisor, and suspended Schneider from association with any broker-dealer in any other capacity for six months. After seven months Osness and Gammon may apply for re-entry into the securities business in a non-principal and non-supervisory capacity upon an adequate showing of proper supervision and subject to the condition that among other things they will handle transactions only in investment company shares or securities of corporations subject to the reporting requirements of the Securities Exchange Act. Following Schneider's suspension she may become employed by a broker-dealer in a non-supervisory capacity upon an adequate showing of proper supervision.

According to the decision, respondents, who were officers of Enterprise Securities Corporation, formerly a registered broker-dealer, sold numerous unregistered securities, including the common stocks of Barr Financial Ltd., American Mining and Development Company and Western Oil and Development Corp., and Schneider also sold the unregistered stock of Industrial Manufacturing Corporation. Respondents made false and misleading statements to customers, and bid for and purchased securities while engaged in their distribution. In addition, it was found that respondents aided and abetted violations in that Enterprise published quotations for securities and submitted quotations for publication in quotation mediums when it did not have in its records required information concerning the security and issuer, maintained fictitious customer accounts, improperly extended credit, had inadequate net capital, and failed to list a controlling person in its registration application. Respondents were also found to have failed to exercise reasonable supervision.

The Commission's order was based on offers of settlement in which the respondents, without admitting or denying the charges, consented to the findings and sanctions. (Rel. 34-10263)

O. GLENN STULL ENJOINED AND BARRED. The SEC today announced that the Federal District Court in San Francisco has permanently enjoined O. Glenn Stull, of Lafayette, California, from violations of antifraud and other provisions of the securities acts. Stull was formerly vice-president of Diamond Management, Inc. (DMI) a registered broker-dealer in San Francisco which acted as principal underwriter and investment adviser of Diamond Growth

Fund, Inc. (Fund), a registered investment company. Stull consented to the injunction as part of a settlement offer submitted to the Commission, without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint.

In a related action also based on the settlement offer, the Commission instituted administrative proceedings against Stull under the Securities Exchange Act and barred him from association with any broker-dealer or investment adviser. After twelve months, however, Stull may be employed in a non-supervisory capacity as a registered representative with a broker-dealer if he first applies for and obtains the Commission's approval.

According to the Commission's decision in the administrative proceedings, during the period January 1970 to October 1972, Stull, in connection with the offer, sale, repurchase and redemption of Fund shares, made material misrepresentations to investors to the effect that Fund was well managed, that DMI was fully and faithfully discharging its fiduciary obligations to Fund, that Fund placed a fair value on certain portfolio securities, and that Fund would not deviate from the investment restrictions set forth in its prospectus without majority shareholder approval. In addition, Stull concealed from investors the fact that Fund's net asset value was overstated, and material facts concerning certain transactions in which he participated as follows:

(a) In October 1970 and February 1971, Fund purchased from DMI a total of 45,000 shares of restricted stock of Dayton Universal, Inc. at a price of \$31,875, which amount was applied against DMI's indebtedness to Fund. The Dayton stock sold to Fund was in fact worth no more than 20% of the market price at the mean for unrestricted Dayton stock, or \$6,375.

(b) During 1971, Fund paid DMI \$23,471 for expenses which were reimbursable to Fund under the terms of DMI's advisory contract. At that time DMI was insolvent and without foreseeable income to reimburse Fund, and the taking of the money in question constituted a borrowing from Fund.

(c) DMI accepted \$2,000 in compensation from an issuer from which Fund purchased a \$25,000 debenture on December 21, 1970. At the time Fund purchased the debenture, the issuer was insolvent.

The Commission further found that Stull aided and abetted violations of net capital, record-keeping and reporting provisions.

Stull consented to the above findings, which were based on the allegations in the injunctive action, agreeing that such allegations could be deemed true solely for purpose of settling the administrative proceeding. (Rel. 34-10266)

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

MAURICE MINUTO SENTENCED. The SEC New York Regional Office announced that on June 8 Maurice Minuto of Farmingdale, New York was sentenced by the Federal court in Manhattan to pay a fine of \$5,000 within 6 months following his plea of guilty to one count of an application charging six counts of criminal contempt. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NEW JERSEY CENTRAL POWER & LIGHT. The SEC has issued an order authorizing the merger of New Jersey Power & Light Company, subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corporation (GPU), into Jersey Central Power and Light Company, also a GPU subsidiary and transactions relating thereto. (Rel. 35-18024)
