U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

DESIGNATION OF NATIONAL MARKET SYSTEM SECURITIES

The Commission has announced the proposal of Rule 11Aa2-1 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, which would provide procedures by which securities would be designated as qualified for trading in a national market system. The Commission also announced the proposal of rule amendments which would require inclusion of certain securities currently traded solely over-the-counter in the consolidated transaction reporting system and application to those securities of Rule 11Ac1-1 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of June 18. (Rel. 34-15926)
