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### THE SPECIAL FUND FOR TIMERS, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until February 14 to request a hearing on the application of The Special Fund for Timers, Inc., a registered, open-end, diversified, management investment company, for an order, pursuant to Section 11(a) and 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, exempting Applicant from the provisions of Sections 2(a)(41) and 22(d) of the Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 thereunder to the extent necessary to permit Applicant to value its portfolio securities by means of the amortized cost method of valuation and to effect its proposed offer of exchange. 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## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission has approved proposed rule changes filed by the following: Pacific Securities Depository Trust Company (SR-PSDTC-82-5) implementing a new system called the National Institutional Delivery System (NIDS). NIDS permits institutional trades among PSDTC members in PSDTC-eligible securities to be electronically confirmed, affirmed and settled at PSDTC and provides members access to the Institutional Delivery System of the Depository Trust Company (DTC) for the confirmation, affirmation and settlement of trades with participants of DTC. (Rel. 34-19437); and the American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-82-11) to rescind Amex Rule 319 (minimum compensation for ABC seatholders); amend Amex Rule 342(b) (outside business activities); rescind Article IV, Section 3(a) of the Amex Constitution (salaried market employees); and amend Article IX, Section 6 of the Amex Constitution (Gratuity Fund). ## AMENDMENT OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. has filed an amendment to a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-NYSE-80-16) to modify NYSE Rules 110 and 116 as they apply to Competitive Traders and stopping stock. Publication of the amendments are expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of January 24. (Rel. 34-19440)
