CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

JAMES R. OVERCASH SENTENCED

The Atlanta Regional Office and the U.S. Attorney for the Middle District of Alabama announced that on January 7 Judge Truman M. Hobbs sentenced James Rufus Overcash of Lanett, Alabama to four years imprisonment on one count of selling unregistered securities and four years imprisonment on one count of mail fraud in connection with Overcash's operation of a Ponzi scheme involving investment contracts. Overcash pled guilty to each of the counts on November 24, 1982. The sentences are to run concurrently.

The indictment alleged that Overcash continued operation of this scheme under the alias of "Charles L. Brooks" after having been permanently enjoined by the Honorable Myron H. Thompson, U.S. District Judge for the Middle District of Alabama, on October 23, 1981, as a result of a civil action brought by the Commission.

Judge Hobbs ordered Overcash immediately remanded to the custody of the Attorney General of the United States to begin serving his sentence. (U.S. v. James Rufus Overcash, a/k/a "Charles L. Brooks," individually and d/b/a J & R Mail Service, U.S.D.C. M.D. Ala., CR-82-12-E). (LR-9872)

BRUCE PAUL INDICTED

The New York Regional Office announced that on January 12 a federal grand jury in New York City filed an 11-count indictment charging Bruce Paul, a stockholder from Purchase, New York, with five counts of perjury in a SEC deposition, five counts of making false statements to federal officers, and one count of obstruction of a SEC proceeding. The indictment charges that Paul perjured himself and made false statements to the Commission during its investigation of leaks of confidential information about impending corporate takeover plans from Morgan Stanley & Co., and Kuhn Loeb & Co. The indictment charges Paul with, among other things, testifying falsely when he denied having material non-public information.

The specific investigation which led to this indictment also produced information and indictments against two investment bankers and four others for illegal trading on confidential information obtained from Morgan Stanley and Kuhn Loeb. One of the investment bankers, Adrian Antoniu, pleaded guilty and has been sentenced to three months in jail. One of the other defendants, James Mitchell Newman, was found guilty of the charges after a jury trial and sentenced to a year and a day in jail. He was also fined \$10,000 and placed on probation for three years. (U.S. v. Bruce Paul, Crim No. 83-CR-14). (LR-9874)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CALIFORNIA MUNICIPAL FUND FOR TEMPORARY INVESTMENT, INC.

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CONSOLIDATED NATURAL GAS COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Consolidated Natural Gas Company (Consolidated), a registered holding company, to invest up to \$1.2 million in CNG Energy Company, subsidiary of Consolidated, by purchasing up to 7,200 shares of CNG Energy's common stock at \$100 per share, its par value, and lending \$480,000 to CNG Energy as construction advances payable on or before May 31, 1983. Consolidated would fund the loans through the sale of debentures and/or internal cash generation. The proceeds would be applied by CNG Energy to install certain facilities at Consolidated Gas Supply Corporation's (Supply) fractionation plant at Hastings, West Virginia. CNG Energy and a nonaffiliate have entered into a contract whereby CNG Energy would fractionate at the plant the mixed liquids extracted from Supply's "wet gas." CNG Energy would enter into a contract with Supply whereby Supply would reserve approximately 26,000 gallons per day of fractionation capacity at the Hastings Plant for CNG Energy and Supply would fractionate the mixed liquids for CNG Energy. NOTICE OF EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A rule change filed by the Philadelphia Depository Trust Company under Rule 19b-4 (SR-Philadep-83-1) has become effective in accordance with Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 authorizing Philadep to: (1) increase the charge for each cash or stock dividend or interest payment; (2) charge the regular deposit fee in addition to the existing fee for processing legal deposits; and (3) establish a new fee for the automated settlement of transactions effected through the Philadelphia Institutional Delivery System.
