ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

WILLAMETTE MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATES, INC. CITED

The Commission announced the entry of an Order Instituting Proceedings under Sections 203(e) and (f) of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 and Findings and Order of the Commission in the Matter of Willamette Management Associates, Inc. Willamette, a Portland, Oregon investment adviser, consented to the entry of the Order which found that it had violated Section 17(b) of the Securities Act of 1933, Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5, and Section 206 of the Investment Advisers by failing to have a reasonable basis for investment advice and by failing to disclose direct or indirect payments from issuers about which it wrote articles. The Commission's Order also censured Willamette and directed it comply with certain undertakings. (Rel. IA-837)

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CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

JOHN ALLEN, OTHERS ENJOINED

The Atlanta Regional and the Miami Branch Offices announced that on January 19 Judge William M. Hoeverler of the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Florida entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Monarch Oil & Gas Corporation (Monarch), Monarch Oil & Gas Ltd. 1982 Oil & Gas Drilling Program (Monarch Ltd.), Tax Planners of America, Inc. and John Allen, also known as John Acord, enjoining them from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. At a hearing for a preliminary injunction held on January 10, the defendants, through their counsel, stipulated to the entry of the Final Judgment without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint. The defendants also stipulated to and the court appointed a receiver for Monarch, Monarch Ltd. and Tax Planners.

The Commission's complaint, filed on December 22, 1982, alleged that the defendants violated the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 by soliciting investors for subscriptions to Monarch Ltd.'s limited partnership units through newspaper advertisements and other means of general solicitation without a registration statement being filed or in effect with the Commission. The complaint also alleged that in connection with the offer and sale of the securities the defendants made material misrepresentations and omitted to state material facts, falsely stating that: the offering was being made to a limited number of persons without general solicitation; Monarch has an agreement with the Miami, Florida law firm of Kaplan & Kaplan to provide legal representation to investors in the event the Internal Revenue Service challenges the tax aspects of its program; Kaplan & Kaplan is Monarch's corporate tax counsel; representing that Monarch has a loan commitment from a bank in London, England when the bank is not registered with the English banking officials; failing to provide a balance sheet and income statement for Monarch; and failing to provide information concerning the business background of Monarch and Monarch's officers. (SEC v. Monarch Oil & Gas Corporation, et al., Civil Action No. 82-6833-CIV-WMH, S.D. Fla.). (LR-9875)

FINAL ORDER ENTERED AGAINST ISAAC BARANOWICZ

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on January 18 Edward Rafeedie of the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California entered a Final Order against Isaac Baranowicz of Los Angeles, California. Baranowicz consented to the entry of the Final Order without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint.

The Commission alleged that Baranowicz, while a director of Specialty Restaurants Corporation, passed non-public, inside information regarding an upcoming tender offer to another defendant. The order prohibits Baranowicz from engaging in such conduct in the future. (SEC v. Isaac Baranowicz, et al., U.S.D.C., C.D. Cal., Civil Action No. 82-3082-ER[Kx]). (LR-9878)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

CONVICTION OF ROBERT S. CHAPPELL AFFIRMED

Sarah Evans Barker, U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of Indiana and the Chicago Regional Office announced that on January 14 the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit affirmed the conviction of Robert S. Chappell. Chappell had been convicted in a jury trial on two counts of mail fraud in connection with his activities as the principal of General Oil, Inc. Chappell falsely represented that investor funds would be utilized for oil and gas exploration and that investor interests in General Oil could be exchanged for an investment in a Pennsylvania holding company. The Pennsylvania holding company never existed. Chappell was sentenced to three years imprisonment and four years probation. (U.S. v. Robert S. Chappell, S.D.I., Indianapolis 79-50 CR). (LR-9879)
