ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

THOMAS J. FURNARI BARRED

Administrative Law Judge Jerome K. Soffer has issued an initial decision barring Charles J. Furnari of Oak Park, Illinois, from association with any broker or dealer. The decision, however, permits him to apply after one year for leave to become associated with a broker-dealer in a non-supervisory, non-proprietary capacity upon making a satisfactory showing to the Commission that he will be adequately supervised.

The sanctions imposed were based upon findings that Furnari had wilfully violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws in connection with a collateralized option writing program he had instituted while employed by Blyth, Eastman, Dillon & Co. and its successor in interest Paine, Webber, Jackson and Curtis, Inc. It was found that he had misrepresented not only the risks inherent in his option trading strategy, but the anticipated rates of return, his success in his trading activities, and the profitability of his endeavors. It was also found that he had engaged in excessive trading ("churning") of his clients' accounts. However, Judge Soffer concluded that a charge that Furnari had misrepresented his past success as a trader on the Chicago Board Options Exchange had not been sustained by the evidence.

NASD ACTION AGAINST PAULSON INVESTMENT COMPANY AND PRESIDENT SET ASIDE; PROCEEDINGS AGAINST SALESMAN REMANDED

The Commission has set aside disciplinary action taken by the NASD against Paulson Investment Company, Inc., a Portland, Oregon brokerage firm, and Chester Paulson, the firm's president. The Commission remanded to the NASD disciplinary proceedings against Donald F. Kunesh, a Paulson Company salesman.

The Commission found, as had the NASD, that Kunesh violated antifraud provisions by failing to disclose to certain customers to whom he recommended a stock for which there was no market that he had recently purchased the same stock for one-third the price. The Commission also affirmed the NASD's finding that Kunesh failed to give his employer proper notification of his purchase. However, the Commission set aside other findings that the NASD made against Kunesh, and determined to remand the proceedings against him to give the NASD an opportunity to reassess his sanctions on the basis of the findings of violation that were sustained.

The Commission concluded that the record did not sustain the NASD's findings that the firm and Paulson failed to exercise proper supervision over Kunesh and other salesmen. (Rel. 34-19603)

FIRST INDEPENDENT STOCK TRANSFER AGENT, INC. CITED

The Commission announced the institution of administrative proceedings pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against First Independent Stock Transfer Agent, Inc. (Registrant), a Denver transfer agent. Simultaneously with the institution of the proceedings, the Commission accepted an Offer of Settlement submitted by Registrant in which it consented to the entry of the findings and the imposition of a revocation of its registration without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations. The Commission's Order found that since February 1, 1979 Registrant wilfully violated the antifraud, recordkeeping, transfer agent turnaround and fingerprint provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and rules thereunder. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CANAVERAL INTERNATIONAL ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on March 21 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Canaveral International Corporation of Miami, Florida, restraining and enjoining it from failing to file timely periodic reports and ordering it to comply with certain undertakings. Canaveral, consenting to the entry of the Court's Judgment, acknowledged that it had filed reports in an untimely manner on 13 separate occasions and had failed to file required Notifications of Late Filing of five separate occasions. The Commission's complaint was filed on January 28, 1983. Canaveral has agreed to adopt certain procedures to assure timely filing of reports required to be filed under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. (SEC v. Canaveral International Corporation, USDC DC, Civil Action No. 83-241). (LR-9941)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

SOUTHWESTERN INVESTORS, INC.
