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CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

COMPLAINT NAMES LESLIE D. MURDOCK, OTHERS

The Denver Regional Office announced that on May 5 a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado naming Leslie D. Murdock of Bedford, Texas (formerly of Salt Lake City, Utah); Glen Dial of the LaTuna Correctional Institution, El Paso, Texas (formerly of Denver, Colorado); Michael L. Allred of Denver, Colorado; Lee Walker of Las Vegas, Nevada; John Hudson of Longmont, Colorado; Dwain Knigge of Salt Lake City, Utah; and American Registrar and Transfer Co., a registered transfer agent in Salt Lake City, Utah. Simultaneously with the filing of the complaint, the Commission filed a Motion for and Memorandum Brief in Support of Preliminary Injunction and Other Equitable Relief against the above-named defendants.

The complaint alleged, among other things, that Murdock, Dial, Allred, Walker and Hudson engaged in the fraudulent sale of unregistered stock of a shell corporation with no significant assets (Golden Phoenix, Inc.) and that such involved, among other things, the purchase of an inactive shell corporation, the attempted infusion into it of assets and the dissemination of false and misleading information to the investing public leading to an unregistered offering and distribution of securities. The complaint also alleged that, to further their overall scheme to defraud, Murdock, Allred, Dial, Walker and Hudson concealed the actual identities of the control persons of Golden Phoenix and set up a sham transfer agent in Clearwater, Florida under the guise of which the restricted legend appearing on certificates of stock were removed. These shares were then sold to the public. The complaint further alleges that Knigge and American aided and abetted the distribution of the unregistered Golden Phoenix stock and that Walker aided and abetted violations of Section 12(g) of the Exchange Act by filing a false Form 10 with the Commission. The complaint further requested that the Court order an accounting and disgorgement and other equitable relief as to all defendants except Knigge and American. (SEC v. Leslie D. Murdock, et al., USDC, Colorado, Civil Action No. 83-777). (LR-9991)

TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER ENTERED AGAINST HOMESTEAD OIL COMPANY, INC., OTHERS

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on May 2 the Honorable Robert W. Porter of the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas, issued a Temporary Restraining Order against Homestead Oil Company, Inc. of Dallas, Texas, Kenneth E. Wilson, Homestead's president and chief executive officer, of Terrell, Texas, and Larry B. Bach, Homestead's general counsel and chairman of the board, of Forney, Texas. The Order temporarily restrains the defendants from further violations and the aiding and abetting of violations of the reporting provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

The complaint, filed on April 29, alleged that Homestead's common stock is registered with the Commission under provisions of the Exchange Act and is traded in the over-the-counter market. The complaint further alleged that Homestead, aided and abetted by Wilson and Bach, violated the registration and reporting provisions of the Exchange Act, by filing a registration statement and a quarterly report with the Commission which contained false and misleading statements and which failed to contain required disclosures, and by failing to file required reports including an annual report and three quarterly reports. Furthermore, the complaint alleged that Wilson and Bach failed to file stock ownership reports with the Commission as required by the Exchange Act. In addition, the complaint alleged that Homestead and Wilson violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of approximately \$1.2 million of investment contracts in five oil and gas drilling programs to at least 125 investors. (SEC v. Homestead Oil Company, Inc., et al., U.S.D.C. ND/TX/Dallas Div., CA 3-83-0730F). (LR-9993)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

CLEO F. RAMSEY INDICTED

Gene S. Anderson, U.S. Attorney for the Western District of Washington, the Seattle Regional Office and Allen Whitaker, Special Agent in Charge of the Seattle office of the FBI, jointly announced that on April 27 the grand jury sitting in Seattle returned a 23-count indictment against Cleo F. Ramsey. The indictment, which included multiple counts of securities fraud, sales of unregistered securities, interstate transportation of stolen property and mail and wire fraud, charges Ramsey with having executed a scheme to defraud investors of \$680,000 during 1977 through 1980 by promoting several purported licensed processes relating to the densification of wood waste for use as fuel. His activities were centered in Washington, Oregon and Montana. A Bench Warrant has been issued for his arrest. (U.S. v. Cleo Francis Ramsey, U.S.D.C. W.D. Wash., Cr. No. 83-27 T). (LR-9994)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

SUN LIFE ASSURANCE COMPANY OF CANADA (U.S.)

An order has been issued on an application by Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada (U.S.), Sun Life of Canada (U.S.) Variable Account A, B, and C, separate accounts registered under the Investment Company Act of 1940 as unit investment trusts, Money Market Variable Account, Capital Appreciation Variable Account, and High Yield Variable Account, separate accounts registered under the Act as management investment companies, Suncan Equity Services Company, and Clarendon Insurance Agency, Inc., pursuant to Section 11 of the Act, approving the terms of certain offers of exchange. WESTPAC BANKING CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 3 to request a hearing on an application of Westpac Banking Corporation, an Australian Bank, and its subsidiary, Westpac Capital Corporation, a Delaware corporation, for an order, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, exempting them from all provisions of the Act in their proposed issuance of commercial paper in the United States. CIMCO MONEY MARKET TRUST

An order, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, has been issued on an application by CIMCO Money Market Trust, a registered, open-end, diversified, management investment company, exempting it from the provisions of Section 2(a)(41) of the Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 thereunder to permit it to value its portfolio securities using the amortized cost valuation method. AMERICAN TRADING AND PRODUCTION CORPORATION

An order has been granted, pursuant to Section 3(b)(2) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, declaring American Trading and Production Corporation, a Maryland corporation, to be primarily engaged in businesses other than that of an investment company. (Rel. IC-13228 - May 10)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing The Columbia Gas System, Inc., a registered holding company, to issue from time to time through December 31, 1983, up to two million shares of common stock in exchange for an amount of its outstanding debentures of comparable market value which would otherwise be reacquired for cash to satisfy normal sinking fund requirements. Columbia has been granted an exception from the competitive bidding requirements of Rule 50 under the Act in order to negotiate the terms of the stock exchange. Jurisdiction has been reserved over the terms and conditions of the exchange. (Rel. 35-22935 - May 11)

NOTICE AND AMENDMENT OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Chicago Board Options Exchange, Incorporated has filed a proposed rule change and a first amendment to the proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-CBOE-83-7) to provide for the listing and trading of options on the CBOE-30 Index, an index which is identical in composition to the Dow Jones Industrial Average. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of May 16. (Rel. 34-19755)

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The American Stock Exchange, Inc. has filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-Amex-83-12) to provide for the listing and trading of options on the Amex "Major Market-30" Index, which is identical in composition to the Dow Jones Industrial Average.
