REVISION OF INDUSTRY GUIDE DISCLOSURES FOR BANK HOLDING COMPANIES

The Commission has issued final amendments to the portions of the Industry Guides for Statistical Disclosures by Bank Holding Companies relating to disclosures about nonaccrual, past due and restructured loans, potential problem loans, foreign outstandings and loan concentrations. (Rel. 33-6478)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

RAPHAEL DAVID BLOOM SUSPENDED

The Commission has suspended Raphael David Bloom from association with any broker or dealer for a period of 60 days, effective August 29. It was found that, in 1981, Bloom, sole general partner of the New York brokerage firm of Jay W. Kaufmann & Co., aided and abetted his firm's violations of recordkeeping, reporting, customer protection, hypothecation, credit extension and fingerprinting provisions.

In affirming the sanction imposed on Bloom by an administrative law judge, the Commission concluded that the sanction was fully warranted in the public interest. The Commission noted that "Bloom, who was in complete charge of his firm, permitted a substantial breakdown in almost every aspect of [its] back-office operations." (Rel. 34-20043)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

MIKHAEL KROLL CHARGED WITH VIOLATIONS OF ADVISERS AND EXCHANGE ACTS

The New York Regional Office announced that a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York on July 28 against Mikhael Kroll alleging that Kroll defrauded his investment advisory clients and converted more than \$300,000 of his clients' money to his own use. The complaint, charging Kroll with violations of Sections 206(1) and (2) of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5, alleges that Kroll falsely held himself out as a professional options trader and promised his clients returns of up to 50 percent on their investments, some of which he represented as being insured and, therefore, riskless. The complaint alleges that Kroll, who immigrated from the Soviet Union in 1979, solicited clients from newly-immigrated members of the Russian community who, for the most part, are financially unsophisticated.

The Commission's complaint further alleges that Kroll engaged in the investment advisory business without having registered with the Commission as an investment adviser, in violation of Section 203(a) of the Advisers Act. Furthermore, the complaint alleges that Kroll entered into investment advisory contracts with his clients which called for his compensation to be based upon a percentage of the client's profits, in violation of Section 205(1) of the Advisers Act.

The complaint seeks, among other things, a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and an Order of the Court freezing Kroll's assets and ordering him to disgorge all proceeds received by him in connection with his advisory business. (SEC v. Mikhael Kroll, 83 Civ. 5635, PNL, S.D.N.Y.). (LR-10091)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

JOHN A. STRANGIS SENTENCED

The Chicago Regional Office and James M. Rosenbaum, U.S. Attorney for the District of Minnesota, announced that on July 26 the Honorable Diana E. Murphy, Judge of the U.S. District Court for the District of Minnesota, Fourth Division, at Minneapolis, sentenced John A. Strangis to three years imprisonment. The sentence was imposed after Strangis pleaded guilty to one count of mail fraud and one count of wire fraud. The indictment arose from Strangis' activities in obtaining monies from investors by guaranteeing high returns within a short period of time.

Previously, on July 12, 1982, Judge Murphy entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Strangis at the Commission's request, enjoining him from violating the antifraud provisions of the securities laws [LR-9733/August 10, 1982]. The Court previously entered a temporary restraining order against Strangis. In the Commission's complaint filed June 16, 1982, the Commission alleged that Strangis, formerly a principal of Minneapolis registered broker-dealer Alstead, Strangis and Dempsey, Inc., defrauded investors in several states through the offer and sale of securities.
