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## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

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### RULE 2(e) PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST MICHAEL CLARK

The Commission announced that administrative proceedings pursuant to Rule 2(e) of the Commission's Rules of Practice were instituted against Michael A. Clark, an attorney. Simultaneously with the institution of the proceedings, Clark consented to the entry of an Order denying him the privilege of appearing or practicing before the Commission. On February 6, 1992, Clark was permanently enjoined from violating the registration requirements of Section 5(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 in connection with his role in selling unregistered securities in the form of investment contracts called the Interbank Program by Jerry David Dominelli and the corporations he controlled. ### COMMISSION REVOKES INVESTMENT ADVISER REGISTRATIONS OF INSTITUTIONAL TREASURY MANAGEMENT, INC. AND DENMAN & COMPANY

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings against registered investment advisers Denman & Company and its successor, Institutional Treasury Management, Inc. (jointly, ITM), pursuant to Section 203(e) of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. The Order was based on the entry of temporary and permanent injunctions against ITM, enjoining it from further fraudulent conduct in violation of the securities laws, fraudulent principal transactions, fraudulent custody of client funds and securities and failure to maintain required books and records. The judgment was entered in the Commission's action SEC v. Institutional Treasury Management, Inc., Denman & Company and Steven D. Wymer, Civil Action No. 91-6715, MRP, C.D. Cal. against ITM and its former principal and sole owner, Steven D. Wymer. Simultaneously with the institution of proceedings, ITM submitted an Offer of Settlement in which, while neither admitting nor denying the findings except as to entry of the injunctions, ITM consented to the entry of the Order, by which their registrations as investment advisers were revoked. ### ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS AGAINST GREGORY CHRISTIAN

The Commission announced the institution of administrative proceedings pursuant to Sections 15(b)(6) and 21C of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Gregory Christian, a former registered representative in the Reno, Nevada office of Wedbush Morgan Securities. The proceedings arise out of Christian's violation of Section 5 of the Securities Act of 1933 for participating in the distribution of the unregistered securities of The Crown Companies Group, Ltd. a/k/a The Crown Gold Companies Group, Ltd.

Simultaneous with the institution of these proceedings, the Commission accepted Christian's Offer of Settlement in which he consents to the entry of an Order by the Commission, without admitting or denying any of the findings contained therein. Christian was ordered to cease and desist from violating Section 5 of the Securities Act and has been suspended from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company or municipal securities dealer for ninety days. #### ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS AGAINST MARTIN ENGELMAN, PETER KIM AND LAWRENCE ISEN

The Commission announced that on April 27, administrative proceedings under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) were instituted against Martin Herer Engelman, Peter Paul Kim, and Lawrence David Isen for violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 (Securities Act), Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder, to determine whether such allegations are true and to determine what, if any remedial sanctions are appropriate.

The order instituting public proceedings alleges that Engelman, Kim and Isen, former branch manager and assistant branch managers, respectively, of the La Jolla, California office of Stuart-James Co., Inc., a now defunct broker-dealer, violated the federal securities laws during the period from April 1988 through at least September 1990, by committing illegal sales practices. The order alleges that Engelman, Kim and Isen, variously, effected unauthorized trades in customer accounts, refused to allow customers' trade orders to be executed promptly, misrepresented the risks associated with investments, made stock price predictions, without a reasonable basis, to customers, made material misrepresentations about issuers, and made unsuitable investment recommendations, all in connection with the sale of securities.

The Commission further alleges that Engelman violated Section 15(b)(6) of the Exchange Act by failing reasonably to supervise Kim and Isen with a view to preventing their violations of the federal securities laws. (Rel. 34-30635)

#### SANCTIONS IMPOSED AGAINST JOHN DOLCEMASCHIO

The Commission announced that John Dolcemaschio (Dolcemaschio) has submitted an Offer of Settlement which the Commission has determined to accept. Dolcemaschio, the former Money Manager of Financial Clearing and Services Corporation (FICS), a now inactive clearing broker-dealer that was located in New York, New York, consented to the entry of an Order Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions (Order) without admitting or denying the allegations contained therein.

The Order alleges that from April 1988 to May 1989, FICS routinely paid-down its customer bank loan at the end of each business week with substitute financing in order to reduce the amount of money needed to be locked-up in its Reserve Bank Account in violation of the customer protection provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act). The Order further alleges that from on or about July 28, 1988, to on or about May 26, 1989, Dolcemaschio aided and abetted FICS's violations of the customer protection provisions of the Exchange Act.

The Order suspends Dolcemaschio from association with certain regulated entities for nine months, orders him to cease and desist from further violations of Section 15(c)(3) of the Exchange Act and Rule 15c3-3 promulgated thereunder, and orders him to deliver an affidavit of compliance to the NYRO stating that he has complied with the terms of his suspension. 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Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
