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RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

PROPOSAL TO AMEND RULE 19h-1

The Commission is publishing for comment a proposal to amend Rule 19h-1 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 concerning the requirements applicable to notices and applications filed by self-regulatory organizations (SRO's) with respect to proposed admissions to, or continuances in, SRO membership or participation or association with a member of persons subject to a statutory disqualification. The amendments would provide additional exceptions from the filing requirements, specify that all SRO's furnish certain detail in their filings to facilitate Commission review of the proposed SRO action and clarify certain of the Rule's current provisions. Comments should be submitted in triplicate to George A. Fitzsimmons, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, 500 North Capitol Street, Washington, DC 20549, on or before April 22 and should refer to File No. S7-878. COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

TABULATIONS OF QUARTERLY INSTITUTIONAL MANAGER REPORTS AVAILABLE

The Commission has announced that tabulations of the reports filed under the institutional investment manager program for the calendar quarter ended December 31, 1980 are now available. These reports, filed under Section 13(f) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 by institutional managers, list holdings of securities over which the reporting managers exercise investment discretion. There are two tabulations: (1) a listing, arranged according to individual security, showing the number of shares of that security held and the name of the investment manager reporting the holding; and (2) a summary listing, also arranged according to individual security, showing the number of shares of that security reported held by all investment managers filing reports. These tabulations are available for public inspection and copying in the Commission's Public Reference Room located at 1100 L Street, N.W., Washington, D.C.

TRADING SUSPENSIONS

TRADING SUSPENDED IN SERVOIL INDUSTRIES, INC.

The Commission announced the temporary suspension of over-the-counter trading in the securities of Servoil Industries, Inc., a Nevada corporation located in New York, New York, for the ten-day period beginning at 9:45 a.m. on March 12 and terminating at midnight (EST) on March 21, 1981.

The Commission suspended trading in the securities of Servoil in view of questions concerning recent market activity in its securities and because of the lack of currently accurate and adequate information concerning (a) the financial condition of Servoil and its affiliates; (b) certain investment interests and assets held by Servoil; (c) royalty and marketing agreements entered into by Servoil; (d) the operational capabilities of Servoil; and (e) the management of Servoil.

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NATIONAL CORPORATION FOR HOUSING PARTNERSHIPS

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 6 to request a hearing on an application of National Corporation for Housing Partnerships (Corporation), and The National Housing Partnership (Partnership), a quasi-governmental entity of which the Corporation is the sole general partner, and the first private organization formed pursuant to Title IX of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1978 to invest through other limited partnerships in government-assisted low and moderate income housing, to amend an existing order of exemption granted January 17, 1970 pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, which exempted the Corporation and the Partnership from all provisions of the Act subject to Applicants' undertaking to adhere to the reporting and proxy requirements of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The amendment proposes to delete this undertaking from the terms of the existing order, thereby relieving Applicants of the obligation to file periodic and current reports and proxy material with the Commission. CALVERT TAX-FREE RESERVES

An order has been issued on an application filed by Calvert Tax-Free Reserves (Applicant), registered under the Investment Company Act of 1940 as an open-end, diversified, management investment company, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act, exempting Applicant's Money Market Portfolio, subject to conditions, from the provisions of Section 2(a)(41) of the Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 thereunder to the extent necessary to permit Applicant to utilize amortized cost valuation for the purpose of pricing the Money Market Portfolio's shares for sale, redemption and repurchase. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY, INC.
