COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

ARO SECURITIES REGULATION AND ENFORCEMENT CONFERENCE ANNOUNCED

U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

The Atlanta Regional Office will sponsor its 3rd annual securities regulation and enforcement conference for accountants, attorneys, financial analysts, broker-dealers, state securities regulators, NASD and stock exchange representatives and other interested persons. The conference will be held on April 29 and 30 at the Peachtree Plaza Hotel in Atlanta, Georgia.

Recognized authorities in their fields will discuss such subjects as: corporate reporting, disclosure, SIPC, recent developments in broker-dealer regulation, registration of municipal bond dealers, and various enforcement, litigation and regulatory problems.

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

ROBERT R. NELSON, OTHERS ENJOINED

The SEC announced the entry on April 16 in the U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Pennsylvania of a final judgment of permanent injunction and ancillary relief against Robert R. Nelson. The judgment against Nelson permanently enjoins him from violating the antifraud, reporting and proxy provisions of the Exchange Act. By the terms of the judgment, Nelson is ordered to pay to the Court the sum of \$10,000 and, in addition, Nelson is prohibited from assuming a position as either an officer or director of any public company except upon a showing satisfactory to the Court that measures have been taken to prevent the conduct alleged in the Commission's complaint or conduct of similar object or purport. Nelson consented to the entry of the judgment without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint.

The complaint in this action was filed on June 6, 1975 and charged Nelson, Cosmopolitan Investors Funding Co., Robert J. DiStefano, Ramon N. D'Onofrio, Alfred P. Herbert, Herbert & D'Onofrio A.G., Ernst Ballmer and Bank Hofmann A.G. with violations of the securities laws. Judgments of permanent injunction by consent have previously been entered in this matter against Cosmopolitan, D'Onofrio and Herbert & D'Onofrio A.G. (SEC v. Cosmopolitan Investors Funding Co., et al., M.D. Pa., Civil Action No. 75-666). (LR-7366)

SUBSTITUTE RECEIVER APPOINTED FOR INTERNATIONAL SCANNING DEVICES, INC.

The Commission announced that Judge John T. Curtin of the U.S. District Court for the Western District of New York has appointed Richard Southard, Esq. as Substitute Receiver for International Scanning Devices, Inc. (ISD), a defendant in a civil injunctive action filed in U.S. District Court, Buffalo, New York -- SEC v. International Scanning Devices, Inc., et al. The order expressly states that it is to have extraterritorial effect, as did the order appointing the original co-receivers. The order appointing the Substitute Receiver further states that it is to take effect upon the resignation or removal of the co-receivers for ISD by a Canadian court in connection with private litigation against ISD in Ontario. (SEC v. International Scanning Devices, Inc., et al., Civil Action No. 74-351 W.D.N.Y.). (LR-7367)

FEDERAL COURT BARS STEINHARDT, FINE, BERKOWITZ & CO. AND MICHAEL STEINHARDT

The Commission announced that the Honorable Malcolm M. Lucas, U.S. District Judge in Los Angeles, California, issued a final judgment of permanent injunction enjoining Steinhardt, Fine, Berkowitz & Co. (SFB & Co.), a private investment partnership located in New York City, from engaging in specified activities, which constitute violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Judge Lucas also entered a final order prohibiting Michael H. Steinhardt (Steinhardt), a general partner of SFB & Co., from engaging in the same activities. Both SFB & Co. and Steinhardt consented to the Court's action without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint, which was filed on March 5, 1974. The complaint resulted from the Commission's investigation into a scheme to manipulate the market price of the stock of the Seaboard Corporation, located in Beverly Hills, California, in connection with a public offering in January 1970, of over one million shares of Seaboard securities and warrants.

Judge Lucas also ordered SFB & Co. to adopt, implement and maintain certain policies and procedures relating to its trading activities designed to prevent the conduct and practices proscribed by the final judgment. Steinhardt was ordered to comply fully with the policies and procedures to be established by SFB & Co. (SEC v. The Seaboard Corp., et al., Civil Action No. 74-567 MML, C.D. Cal.). (LR-7368)

An order has been issued on an application of Life Insurance Company of North America (LINA), a Pennsylvania stock life insurance company, and Life Insurance Company of North America Separate Account A, a separate account of LINA registered as a unit investment trust under the Investment Company Act of 1940, modifying previous orders granting exemptions from the provisions of Section 27(a)(4) of the Act and approving an offer of exchange pursuant to Section 11 of the Act. LINCOLN NATIONAL DIRECT PLACEMENT FUND

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 18 to request a hearing on an application of Lincoln National Direct Placement Fund, Inc., a non-diversified, closed-end management investment company, and Lincoln National Life Insurance Company, an Indiana stock life insurance company, filed pursuant to Section 17(d) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 and Rule 17d-1 thereunder and Section 17(b) of the Act, for an order exempting certain transactions involving the purchase of a new issue of notes of the Southern Company. AMERICAN AIRLINES INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 24 to request a hearing on an application by American Airlines, Inc. pursuant to Section 310(b)(1)(ii) of the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 declaring that the trusteeship of Bankers Trust Company under five existing indentures and under a proposed indenture is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary in the public interest or for the protection of investors to disqualify Bankers Trust Company from acting as trustee under one of these indentures.
