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DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANCE COMMISSION

B. J. LERNER AND COMPANY, INC.

The Commission has issued an order revoking the registration of B. J. Lerner and Company, Inc. as a broker-dealer based upon the failure of the respondent to appear at hearings in administrative proceedings on March 9, 1976 of which it was duly notified and therefore the respondent was in default. (Rel. 34-12346)

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

COMPLAINT NAMES LOUIS BOURGUIGNON

The Denver Regional Office announced the filing of a civil complaint in the Federal District Court for the District of New Mexico, Albuquerque, New Mexico, on April 15 seeking to enjoin Louis Bourguignon of Albuquerque, New Mexico from violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws.

The complaint alleges, among other things, that the defendant made a fraudulent unregistered offering of the following securities: common stock, pre-incorporation interests and participations in profit sharing agreements of Lobo Holding Corporation, a New Mexico corporation; investment contracts in the form of allotments of land under the Desert Land Entry Act; the common stock of Santa Fe Mortgage, an Arizona corporation; and the common stock of Nezona, Inc., an Arizona corporation. (SEC v. Louis Bourguignon, D. New Mexico, Civil Action No. 76-232-M). (LR-7372)

COMPLAINT NAMES HIGH VALLEY INVESTMENTS, OTHERS

The Seattle Regional Office filed a complaint on April 8 in Federal District Court, Missoula, Montana seeking to enjoin High Valley Investments, Inc., a Nevada corporation, Charles von Goerken of Saint Ignatius, Montana, and Robert A. Wagner of Phoenix, Arizona from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The alleged violations stem from the unregistered sale of fractional undivided interests in oil and gas leases to members of the public. The complaint also alleges untrue statements about the risk in the venture, ownership of the leases, use of inves-tors' funds, and return on the investment. (SEC v. High Valley Investments, Inc., et al., D. Mont. Missoula Div., CV-76-39-M). (LR-7373)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES
