RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

NEW OPTIONAL REGISTRATION STATEMENT FORM. AND TWO RULES PROPOSED

The Commission is proposing for comment a new optional registration statement form, Form S-20, to be used to register options under the Securities Act of 1933, and two rules, Rule 9b-1 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, which would establish an options disclosure document containing information concerning options and options trading, and Rule 135b, which would exempt the disclosure document from the requirements of Section 5 of the Securities Act. The proposals are intended to foster better investor understanding of standardized options trading and to reduce compliance costs by shifting much of the information currently set forth in the registration statement into a new disclosure document containing a simplified explanation of options trading, which would be subject only to antifraud liability.

SUPPLEMENTAL DISCLOSURE OF OIL AND GAS PRODUCING ACTIVITIES; PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF RULES

The Commission has announced proposed amendments to its requirements for supplemental oil and gas disclosures to require compliance with the provisions of a statement of financial accounting standards which is expected to be issued by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB). The proposed amendments would also eliminate certain requirements for oil and gas disclosures set forth in Industry Guide 2 which duplicate requirements in Regulation S-X and an exposure draft recently issued by the FASB.

Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
