# **RULES AND RELATED MATTERS**

ADOPTION OF AMENDMENTS TO RULES 236, 237 AND 16a-9

The Commission has adopted amendments to certain exemptive rules to raise the dollar limits of the exemptions in order to compensate for inflation since the time the rules were adopted. The rules affected are Rules 236 and 237 under the Securities Act of 1933 and Rule 16a-9 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Commission has also rescinded Rules 234 and 235 under the Securities Act and Rules 12a-1, 12a-2 and 12a-3 under the Exchange Act. Those rules have become obsolete due to Congressional or judicial action or the passage of time. (Rel. 33-6414)

### CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES ISAAC BARANOWICZ, OTHERS

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on June 21 a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California, naming as defendants Isaac Baranowicz, William A. Mallet and Michael Chang. The complaint alleges violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder in connection with purchases of the common stock of Specialty Restaurants Corporation (SRC). The complaint alleges that Chang, a former financial consultant to SRC and assistant to its president, purchased SRC common stock while in the possession of material non-public information concerning a proposed SRC tender offer for all of its outstanding common stock. The complaint further alleges that Baranowicz, a director of SRC, tipped Mallet, a friend and business client, of the proposed tender offer and that Mallet purchased SRC common stock based on the material non-public tender offer information. The complaint seeks orders of permanent injunction against each of the defendants and orders requiring Chang and Mallet to disgorge all profits from their purchases and sales of SRC common stock.

Simultaneous with the filing of the complaint, Chang consented, without admitting or denying any of the allegations, to the entry of an order of permanent injunction enjoining him from any further violations of the antifraud provisions, and to the entry of an order requiring him to disgorge \$5,562.60 to the sellers of the SRC common stock he purchased. # CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

JOHN SURGENT, JR. SENTENCED

The New York Regional Office announced that on June 9 John W. Surgent was sentenced to ten years imprisonment by the Honorable Thomas P. Griesa, U.S. District Judge in the Southern District of New York. The sentence followed Surgent's conviction by a jury on 16 counts of conspiracy, sale of unregistered securities, mail and wire fraud and subornation of perjury. Surgent was convicted of setting up a company, World Gambling Corp., which was publicly traded on the over-the-counter market, and then fraudulently selling control stock in the corporation through the use of nominee accounts at various brokerage firms. In addition, Surgent was convicted of looting two subsidiaries acquired by World Gambling Corp. Surgent suborned perjury during a Commission investigation into the activities of World Gambling Corp. (U.S. v. John W. Surgent, Jr., et al., 81 Cr. 773, S.D.N.Y., TPG). (LR-9703)

#### RICHARD ALLEN DANIELS, OTHERS INDICTED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on June 8 an indictment was returned in U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Ohio charging Richard Allen Daniels, Thomas Price Flynn and John Stevens Kackloudis with violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws, conspiracy, mail fraud and interstate transportation of stolen property.

The three defendants were formerly officers and directors of Price, Allen & Stevens Securities Corporation, a Cleveland, Ohio broker-dealer, whose registration with the Commission was revoked on September 6, 1979. In addition, pursuant to their consent, Daniels, Flynn and Kackloudis were barred from association with any broker, dealer, investment company, investment adviser, or any affiliate thereof. Further, Price, Allen & Stevens Securities Corporation and the defendants were, by consent, permanently enjoined on July 19, 1978 from violating various provisions of the securities laws. (U.S. v. ### INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

### IDS LIFE SEPARATE ACCOUNTS C, D, AND E

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 21 to request a hearing on an application by IDS Life Insurance Company (IDS Life), IDS Life Separate Account C, IDS Life Separate Account D and IDS Life Separate Account E (the Separate Accounts), for an order granting exemptions to the extent requested pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 from Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 22(c), 26(a), 26(a)(2)(c), 27(c)(1), 27(c)(2), and 27(d) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 and Rule 22c-1 thereunder and for an order pursuant to Section 11 of the Act approving certain offers of exchange. The Separate Accounts are registered under the Act collectively as a unit investment trust. IDS Life is the depositor of the Separate Accounts. IDS Life will also act as principal underwriter of variable annuity contracts offered by it and the Separate Accounts. (Rel. IC-12510 - June 29)

### FOUNDERS OF AMERICAN INVESTMENT CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 21 to request a hearing on the application of Founders of American Investment Company, for an order, pursuant to Section 3(b)(2) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, declaring Applicant to be primarily engaged in a business other than that of an investment company under the Act and, pursuant to Section 8(f) of the Act, terminating Applicant's registration under the Act. ### IDS LIFE SEPARATE ACCOUNTS F,G, AND H

## **SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS**

#### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved a proposed rule change filed by the National Securities Clearing Corporation (SR-NSCC-82-10) that would amend NSCC Rule 4 regarding the calculation of certain participants' minimum clearing fund contributions. NSCC has filed the proposed rule change on a temporary basis, to be effective until January 1, 1983. In substance, the proposed rule change would impose an increased clearing fund requirement on each NSCC member that (1) uses NSCC's Envelope Settlement Systems (ESS); and (2) carries in ESS, on the average, a daily net debit balance. In addition, the case of a broker-dealer member, the minimum clearing fund requirement shall be increased if such average daily debit balance is greater than that member's excess net capital as determined under SEC Rule 15c3-1. The proposed rule change, however, does not affect other aspects of NSCC's clearing fund requirements. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of June 28. (Rel. 34-18852)
