ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST CARRET AND COMPANY, INC.

Public administrative proceedings have been instituted under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 naming as respondent, Carret and Company, Inc., a registered investment adviser and broker-dealer with its principal place of business in New York City. Simultaneously with the institution of proceedings, the Commission accepted an Offer of Settlement in which Carret, without admitting or denying the alleged violations, consented to the entry of findings, an order placing certain limitations on Carret's activities, functions and operations as an investment adviser and broker-dealer and ordering him to comply with certain undertakings. Specifically, the Commission found that Carret wilfully violated (1) the agency cross transaction provisions of the Advisers Act (Section 206(3)) with respect to the investment advisory business of Carret, and (2) the extension of credit provisions of the Exchange Act (Section 7(c) and Regulation T) with respect to the brokerage business of Carret.

The Commission's Order places limitations on the activities, functions and operations of Carret for a period of ten business days. Specifically, Carret will be prohibited during this period from opening any new accounts for its advisory or brokerage business and from acting as a market maker other than with respect to securities for which it had been previously making a market. In addition, Carret will be prohibited from soliciting or recommending the purchase or sale of any security to any customer or prospective customer except as necessary to protect clients' interest in securities positions held by such clients. Carret, during this period of limitation, may continue to service existing customer accounts where it has discretionary authority. Carret also agreed to comply with an undertaking requiring it to contribute its net profit generated during the ten day period of limitation to the Securities Investor Protection Corporation pursuant to a plan submitted to, and approved by, the New York Regional Office. The undertaking also provides for Carret to institute compliance procedures designed to prevent a recurrence of the violations of the Advisers Act and the Exchange Act. (Rel. IA-816)

MERRILL LYNCH, PIERCE, FENNER & SMITH, INC., OTHERS CITED

Public administrative proceedings have been instituted against Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith Inc., a registered broker-dealer with its principal offices in New York, New York, and ten employees or former employees of four of Merrill's branch offices located in Cleveland, Ohio, Columbus, Ohio, Southfield, Michigan, and Detroit, Michigan. The ten Merrill employees are Paul R. Busch, Harmon C. Hurt, Stephen M. Wirt, and Joan Lee, former registered representatives at Merrill; Roland L. Meulebrouck and Robert Wilds, registered representatives at Merrill; and Dean Hutton, Richard Brandt, Frederick Pickard, and Frederic McComas, current employees of Merrill who were managers of Merrill's branch offices during the period of time the violative conduct discussed below occurred.

The Order for Proceedings alleges that Merrill, Busch, Hurt, Wirt, Meulebrouck, Lee, and Wilds wilfully violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 in connection with the offer and sale of exchange listed options. The Order further alleges that Merrill, Hutton, Brandt, Pickard and McComas failed to reasonably supervise employees under their supervision and control.

The Commission simultaneously accepted Offers of Settlement submitted by all of the respondents wherein they consented to findings of wilful violations without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's Order, and the sanctions set forth below.

The Commission's Order accepting the settlements censures Merrill, Hutton, Brandt, Pickard and McComas; suspends Busch from association with any broker or dealer, for a period of 12 months; and suspends Hurt, Wirt, Muelebrouck, Wilds, and Lee from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company or affiliate thereof for periods of six months, 60 days, 20 days, 10 days and 10 days, respectively.

Additionally, in its Offer of Settlement, Merrill states that it will make offers of restitution to certain of its customers. In addition Merrill states that it will adopt certain procedures designed to improve its capability to survey and control options transactions in customer accounts and establish an Option Review Committee to implement such procedures, to assure that all procedures and policies are in accordance with the self-regulatory guidelines and to implement other new or revised policies and procedures, where warranted, in connection with Merrill's option business.

In addition, Hutton, Brandt, Pickard, and McComas each states in his Offer of Settlement that he will be retrained as a supervisor for a ten business day period, during which time he will relinquish supervisory responsibility, and that he will requalify as a registered option principal. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CIVIL INJUNCTIVE ACTION AGAINST SEVERYN ASHKENAZY, OTHERS SETTLED

The Commission announced on August 4 the settlement of a civil injunctive action which was filed on April 13 against Severyn Ashkenazy, Ashkenazy Enterprises, Inc., Marshall M. Goldblatt, Harold R. Brown, and Fred Roven. The Commission's complaint alleged violations of the antifraud and beneficial ownership reporting provisions of the securities laws in connection with purchases of and activities concerning the securities of Financial Federation, Inc. The defendants, without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint, entered into Stipulations with the Commission which set forth certain undertakings to be complied with by the defendants and provided for the termination of the litigation. The U.S. District Court for the Central District of California entered an Order requiring Severyn Ashkenazy, Ashkenazy Enterprises and Goldblatt to comply with certain undertakings set forth in Stipulations between the Commission and these defendants and approved the Stipulations between the Commission and Brown and Roven also containing certain undertakings.

The Stipulations entered into by the defendants provide that each undertakes and agrees that he will not act or agree to act with any other person for the purpose of acquiring, holding, voting or disposing of any class of equity securities if he and such other person directly or indirectly, singly or in the aggregate beneficially own more than five percent of such securities unless he has, within the time required by Section 13(d), sent to the appropriate issuer and exchanges and filed with the Commission a statement containing the information required by Section 13(d). Severyn Ashkenazy, Ashkenazy Enterprises and Goldblatt, in their Stipulations, agreed to comply with certain additional undertakings relating to the filing of statements on Schedule 13(d), and the acquisition of securities. Severyn Ashkenazy further agreed to file an amendment to a previously filed Schedule 13D concerning the securities of Financial Federation to which he will attach copies of the Commission's complaint and the Stipulations of each of the defendants.
